1-19 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
 1-20 AN ACT

1-21 relating to recommendations by local school health advisory  
 1-22 councils regarding opioid addiction and abuse education in public  
 1-23 schools.

1-24 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-25 SECTION 1. Section 28.004(c), Education Code, is amended to  
 1-26 read as follows:

1-27 (c) The local school health advisory council's duties  
 1-28 include recommending:

1-29 (1) the number of hours of instruction to be provided  
 1-30 in health education;

1-31 (2) policies, procedures, strategies, and curriculum  
 1-32 appropriate for specific grade levels designed to prevent obesity,  
 1-33 cardiovascular disease, Type 2 diabetes, and mental health concerns  
 1-34 through coordination of:

1-35 (A) health education;

1-36 (B) physical education and physical activity;

1-37 (C) nutrition services;

1-38 (D) parental involvement;

1-39 (E) instruction to prevent the use of  
 1-40 e-cigarettes, as defined by Section 161.081, Health and Safety  
 1-41 Code, and tobacco;

1-42 (F) school health services;

1-43 (G) counseling and guidance services;

1-44 (H) a safe and healthy school environment; and

1-45 (I) school employee wellness;

1-46 (3) appropriate grade levels and methods of  
 1-47 instruction for human sexuality instruction;

1-48 (4) strategies for integrating the curriculum  
 1-49 components specified by Subdivision (2) with the following elements  
 1-50 in a coordinated school health program for the district:

1-51 (A) school health services;

1-52 (B) counseling and guidance services;

1-53 (C) a safe and healthy school environment; and

1-54 (D) school employee wellness; ~~and~~

1-55 (5) if feasible, joint use agreements or strategies  
 1-56 for collaboration between the school district and community  
 1-57 organizations or agencies; and

1-58 (6) appropriate grade levels and curriculum for  
 1-59 instruction regarding opioid addiction and abuse and methods of  
 1-60 administering an opioid antagonist, as defined by Section 483.101,  
 1-61 Health and Safety Code.

2-1 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives  
2-2 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as  
2-3 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this  
2-4 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this  
2-5 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.

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
