4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 437, Health and Safety Code, is amended
6	by adding Section 437.025 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 437.025. REQUIREMENTS FOR DOGS IN OUTDOOR DINING
8	AREAS; MUNICIPAL PREEMPTION. (a) A food service establishment may
9	permit a customer to be accompanied by a dog in an outdoor dining
10	area if:
11	(1) the establishment posts a sign in a conspicuous
12	location in the area stating that dogs are permitted;
13	(2) the customer and dog access the area directly from
14	the exterior of the establishment;
15	(3) the dog does not enter the interior of the
16	<pre>establishment;</pre>
17	(4) the customer keeps the dog on a leash and controls
18	the dog;
19	(5) the customer does not allow the dog on a seat,
20	table, countertop, or similar surface; and
21	(6) in the area, the establishment does not:
22	(A) prepare food; or
23	(B) permit open food other than food that is
24	being served to a customer.

(b) A municipality may not adopt or enforce an ordinance,
rule, or similar measure that imposes a requirement on a food
service establishment for a dog in an outdoor dining area that is
more stringent than the requirements described by Subsection (a).
(c) The requirements described by Subsection (a) do not
apply to a service animal, as defined by Section 437.023(c).
SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
