A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the office of minority statistics and engagement in the Department of Family and Protective Services. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 40, Human Resources Code, 5 is amended by adding Section 40.043 to read as follows: 6 7 Sec. 40.043. OFFICE OF MINORITY STATISTICS AND ENGAGEMENT. (a) In this section: 8 (1) "Institution of higher education" has the meaning 9 assigned by Section 61.003, Education Code. 10 (2) "Office" means the office of minority statistics 11 12 and engagement established under this section. 13 (b) Using existing resources, the department, in 14 consultation with an institution of higher education and the child welfare community, shall establish an office of minority statistics 15 and engagement within the department to address the 16 disproportionality in the rate of use of child protective and 17 welfare services by and the provision of those services to children 18 who are members of a racial or ethnic minority group and are in the 19 child welfare system. 20 21 (c) In collaboration with an institution of higher education and appropriate persons in the child welfare community, 22 23 the office shall identify the causes of the disproportionality described by Subsection (b) and develop recommendations for 24

1	addressing those causes and for improving the rate of use of child
2	protective and welfare services by and the provision of those
3	services to children and their families. In identifying the causes
4	and developing recommendations, the office shall:
5	(1) share with the institution any information
6	necessary for the institution to assist in identifying the causes
7	and developing recommendations;
8	(2) consider the unique needs and resources of this
9	state; and
10	(3) consider the outcomes for children in the child
11	welfare system and the services necessary to improve the outcomes.
12	(d) The office shall annually submit a written report to the
13	governor, lieutenant governor, speaker of the house of
14	representatives, and chair of each standing legislative committee
15	with primary jurisdiction over the department that includes:
16	(1) the recommendations developed under Subsection
17	<u>(c);</u>
18	(2) methods to address disproportionality across the
19	child welfare system; and
20	(3) a summary of the initiatives developed by the
21	department during the preceding year to address the causes of
22	disproportionality identified in Subsection (c).
23	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
