1	AN ACT
2	relating to the allocation of housing tax credits to developments
3	within proximate geographical areas.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 2306.6711, Government Code, is amended
6	by amending Subsection (f) and adding Subsection (f-1) to read as
7	follows:
8	(f) Except as provided by Subsection $(f-1)$, the $[The]$ board
9	may allocate housing tax credits to more than one development in a
10	single community, as defined by department rule, in the same
11	calendar year only if the developments are or will be located more
12	than two linear miles apart. This subsection applies only to
13	communities contained within counties with populations exceeding
14	one million.
15	(f-1) The board may allocate housing tax credits to more
16	than one development in a single community only if:
17	(1) the community is located in:
18	(A) a county with a population of four million or
19	more; and
20	(B) an area that is a federally declared disaster
21	area; and
22	(2) the governing body of the municipality containing
23	the development or, if located outside a municipality, the county
24	containing the development:

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- 1 (A) has by vote specifically authorized the
- 2 allocation of housing tax credits for the development; and
- 3 (B) is authorized to administer disaster
- 4 recovery funds as a subgrant recipient.
- 5 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to an application for low income housing tax credits that is submitted 6 7 to the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs during an application cycle that is based on the 2020 qualified allocation 8 9 plan or a subsequent plan adopted by the governing board of the 10 department. An application that is submitted during an application cycle that is based on an earlier qualified allocation plan is 11 governed by the law in effect on the date the application cycle 12 began, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. 13
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
