S.B. No. 500

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

1
2 relating to making supplemental appropriations and reductions in
3 appropriations and giving direction, including direction regarding
4 reimbursement, and adjustment authority regarding appropriations.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION REDUCTION: PUBLIC FINANCE
7 AUTHORITY. The unencumbered appropriations from the general
8 revenue fund to the Public Finance Authority made by Chapter 605
9 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the
10 General Appropriations Act), for use during the state fiscal
11 biennium ending August 31, 2019, for bond debt service payments,
12 including appropriations subject to Rider 3, page I-48, Chapter 605
13 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the
14 General Appropriations Act), to the bill pattern of the
15 appropriations to the authority, are reduced by a total aggregate
16 of \$35,078,954. The authority shall identify the strategies and
17 objectives to which the reduction is to be allocated and the amount
18 of the reduction for each of those strategies and objectives.

19 SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION REDUCTION: FACILITIES
20 COMMISSION. The unencumbered appropriations from the general
21 revenue fund to the Facilities Commission made by Chapter 605 (S.B.
22 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the
23 General Appropriations Act), for use during the state fiscal
24 biennium ending August 31, 2019, for lease payments are reduced by

1 \$17,589,128. The commission shall identify the strategies and
2 objectives to which the reduction is to be allocated and the amount
3 of the reduction for each of those strategies and objectives.

4 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION REDUCTION: TEXAS EDUCATION
5 AGENCY; SUM-CERTAIN APPROPRIATION FOR FOUNDATION SCHOOL PROGRAM.

6 (a) The unencumbered appropriations from the Foundation School
7 Fund, general revenue account number 0193, to the Texas Education
8 Agency made by Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature,
9 Regular Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act), for use
10 during the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, for
11 Strategy A.1.1., FSP - Equalized Operations, as listed in that Act,
12 are reduced by \$643,000,000.

13 (b) Notwithstanding Rider 3, page III-5, Chapter 605 (S.B.
14 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the
15 General Appropriations Act), to the bill pattern of the
16 appropriations to the Texas Education Agency, the sum-certain
17 appropriation to the Foundation School Program for the state fiscal
18 year ending August 31, 2019, is \$21,919,735,602.

19 SECTION 4. TEXAS EDUCATION AGENCY: ADDITIONAL
20 APPROPRIATIONS FOR SCHOOL SAFETY. In addition to amounts
21 previously appropriated for the state fiscal biennium ending August
22 31, 2019, \$100,000,000 is appropriated from the economic
23 stabilization fund to the Texas Education Agency for the two-year
24 period beginning on the effective date of this Act to provide
25 funding to public schools under Strategy B.2.2., Health and Safety,
26 as listed in Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature,
27 Regular Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act), for the

1 following purposes related to enhancing school safety:

2 (1) exterior doors with push bars;

3 (2) metal detectors at school entrances;

4 (3) erected vehicle barriers;

5 (4) security systems that monitor and record school
6 entrances, exits, and hallways;

7 (5) campus-wide active shooter alarm systems that are
8 separate from fire alarms;

9 (6) two-way radio systems;

10 (7) perimeter security fencing;

11 (8) bullet-resistant glass or film for school
12 entrances; and

13 (9) door-locking systems.

14 SECTION 5. COMPTROLLER OF PUBLIC ACCOUNTS: TEXAS TOMORROW
15 FUND. In addition to amounts previously appropriated for the state
16 fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, the amount necessary to
17 fund the prepaid higher education tuition program described by
18 Section 19, Article VII, Texas Constitution, for the two-year
19 period beginning on the effective date of this Act (estimated to be
20 \$210,981,159) is appropriated from the economic stabilization fund
21 to the comptroller of public accounts for that period for the
22 purpose of immediately depositing that amount in the Texas tomorrow
23 fund created under that section.

24 SECTION 6. TRUSTEED PROGRAMS WITHIN THE OFFICE OF THE
25 GOVERNOR: DISASTER GRANTS. In addition to amounts previously
26 appropriated for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019,
27 \$100,000,000 is appropriated from the economic stabilization fund

1 to the Trusteed Programs within the Office of the Governor for the
2 two-year period beginning on the effective date of this Act for
3 disaster grants under Strategy A.1.1., Disaster Funds, as listed in
4 Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular
5 Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act).

6 SECTION 7. JUDICIARY SECTION, COMPTROLLER'S DEPARTMENT:
7 LONGEVITY PAY. In addition to amounts previously appropriated for
8 the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$500,000 is
9 appropriated from the general revenue fund to the Judiciary
10 Section, Comptroller's Department, for the state fiscal year ending
11 August 31, 2019, for reimbursing counties for longevity pay made to
12 eligible assistant district attorneys under Strategy D.1.1.,
13 Assistant Prosecutor Longevity Pay, as listed in Chapter 605 (S.B.
14 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the
15 General Appropriations Act).

16 SECTION 8. HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES COMMISSION:
17 REPLACEMENT OF MONEY TRANSFERRED TO ADDRESS NEEDS RESULTING FROM
18 HURRICANE HARVEY. In addition to amounts previously appropriated
19 for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$110,000,000
20 is appropriated from the economic stabilization fund to the Health
21 and Human Services Commission for the state fiscal year ending
22 August 31, 2019, for Medicaid client services under Strategy
23 A.1.5., Children, as listed in Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the
24 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the General
25 Appropriations Act), to replace money transferred from that
26 strategy to disaster assistance programs to address needs resulting
27 from Hurricane Harvey.

1 SECTION 9. HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES COMMISSION: MEDICAID
2 SHORTFALL. In addition to amounts previously appropriated for the
3 state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$2,100,000,000 is
4 appropriated from the general revenue fund, and \$2,300,000,000 is
5 appropriated from federal funds, to the Health and Human Services
6 Commission for the state fiscal year ending August 31, 2019, for
7 Medicaid client services under Goal A, Medicaid Client Services, as
8 listed in Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature,
9 Regular Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act).

10 SECTION 10. HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES COMMISSION: STATE
11 HOSPITALS. In addition to amounts previously appropriated for the
12 state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$300,000,000 is
13 appropriated from the economic stabilization fund to the Health and
14 Human Services Commission for the two-year period beginning on the
15 effective date of this Act for continuing improvements to state
16 hospital facilities under Strategy G.4.2., Facility Capital
17 Repairs and Renovations, as listed in Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of
18 the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the General
19 Appropriations Act).

20 SECTION 11. DEPARTMENT OF FAMILY AND PROTECTIVE SERVICES:
21 FOSTER CARE. In addition to amounts previously appropriated for
22 the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$83,542,916 is
23 appropriated from the general revenue fund to the Department of
24 Family and Protective Services for the state fiscal year ending
25 August 31, 2019, for foster care payments under Strategy B.1.9.,
26 Foster Care Payments, as listed in Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the
27 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the General

1 Appropriations Act).

2 SECTION 12. DEPARTMENT OF FAMILY AND PROTECTIVE SERVICES:
3 RELATIVE CAREGIVER PAYMENTS. (a) In addition to amounts
4 previously appropriated for the state fiscal biennium ending August
5 31, 2019, \$6,833,593 is appropriated from the general revenue fund
6 to the Department of Family and Protective Services for the state
7 fiscal year ending August 31, 2019, for relative caregiver payments
8 under Strategy B.1.11., Relative Caregiver Payments, as listed in
9 Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular
10 Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act).

11 (b) The unencumbered appropriations from federal Temporary
12 Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) funds to the Department of
13 Family and Protective Services made by Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of
14 the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the General
15 Appropriations Act), for use during the state fiscal biennium
16 ending August 31, 2019, for relative caregiver payments under
17 Strategy B.1.11., Relative Caregiver Payments, as listed in that
18 Act, are reduced by \$8,481,040.

19 SECTION 13. DEPARTMENT OF FAMILY AND PROTECTIVE SERVICES:
20 DAY CARE. In addition to amounts previously appropriated for the
21 state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$23,060,052 is
22 appropriated from federal Child Care and Development Block Grant
23 funds to the Department of Family and Protective Services for the
24 state fiscal year ending August 31, 2019, for day care payments
25 under Strategy B.1.3., TWC Contracted Day Care, as listed in
26 Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular
27 Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act).

1 SECTION 14. TEXAS EDUCATION AGENCY: EXPENSES RELATED TO
2 HURRICANE HARVEY. In addition to amounts previously appropriated
3 for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, the following
4 amounts are appropriated from the economic stabilization fund to
5 the Texas Education Agency for the state fiscal year ending August
6 31, 2019, for Strategy A.1.1., FSP - Equalized Operations, as
7 listed in Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature,
8 Regular Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act), for the
9 following purposes related to increased state costs under the
10 Foundation School Program resulting from Hurricane Harvey:

- 11 (1) \$271,300,000 for:
- 12 (A) increased student costs;
- 13 (B) the reduction in school district property
14 values; and
- 15 (C) the reduction of the amount owed by school
16 districts under Chapter 41, Education Code, due to disaster
17 remediation costs as provided by Section 41.0931, Education Code;
18 and

19 (2) \$634,200,000 for the adjustment of school district
20 property values under Section 42.2523, Education Code, and
21 reimbursement to school districts for disaster remediation costs
22 under Section 42.2524, Education Code.

23 SECTION 15. TEACHER RETIREMENT SYSTEM: STATE CONTRIBUTION.
24 In addition to amounts previously appropriated for the state fiscal
25 biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$542,000,000 is appropriated from
26 the economic stabilization fund to the Teacher Retirement System
27 for the state fiscal year ending August 31, 2019, for the purpose of

1 immediately depositing that amount as a state contribution in the
2 Teacher Retirement System Trust Account number 0960.

3 SECTION 16. KILGORE COLLEGE: HIGHER EDUCATION GROUP
4 INSURANCE CONTRIBUTIONS. In addition to amounts previously
5 appropriated for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019,
6 \$1,238,238 is appropriated from the general revenue fund to Kilgore
7 College for the state fiscal year ending August 31, 2019, to provide
8 for state contributions for health benefits.

9 SECTION 17. UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS AT AUSTIN: MARINE SCIENCE
10 INSTITUTE. In addition to amounts previously appropriated for the
11 state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$14,750,000 is
12 appropriated from the economic stabilization fund to The University
13 of Texas at Austin for the two-year period beginning on the
14 effective date of this Act for storm damage prevention and
15 compliance and the mitigation of damages related to Hurricane
16 Harvey under Strategy C.2.1., Marine Science Institute, as listed
17 in Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular
18 Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act).

19 SECTION 18. TEXAS STATE TECHNICAL COLLEGE - WACO: CAMPUS
20 CONSTRUCTION. In addition to amounts previously appropriated for
21 the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$29,644,640 is
22 appropriated from the general revenue fund to the Texas State
23 Technical College - Waco for the two-year period beginning on the
24 effective date of this Act for the abatement and demolition of
25 certain facilities on the campus. The legislature finds there is a
26 demonstrated need to undertake this abatement and demolition.

27 SECTION 19. UNIVERSITY OF HOUSTON: EXPENSES RELATED TO

1 HURRICANE HARVEY. In addition to amounts previously appropriated
2 for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$20,288,883
3 is appropriated from the economic stabilization fund to the
4 University of Houston for the two-year period beginning on the
5 effective date of this Act for expenses related to Hurricane
6 Harvey.

7 SECTION 20. UNIVERSITY OF HOUSTON - DOWNTOWN: EXPENSES
8 RELATED TO HURRICANE HARVEY. In addition to amounts previously
9 appropriated for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019,
10 \$4,000,000 is appropriated from the economic stabilization fund to
11 the University of Houston - Downtown for the two-year period
12 beginning on the effective date of this Act for expenses related to
13 Hurricane Harvey.

14 SECTION 21. UNIVERSITY OF HOUSTON - VICTORIA: EXPENSES
15 RELATED TO HURRICANE HARVEY. In addition to amounts previously
16 appropriated for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019,
17 \$1,703,828 is appropriated from the economic stabilization fund to
18 the University of Houston - Victoria for the two-year period
19 beginning on the effective date of this Act for expenses related to
20 Hurricane Harvey.

21 SECTION 22. UNIVERSITY OF HOUSTON - CLEAR LAKE: EXPENSES
22 RELATED TO HURRICANE HARVEY. In addition to amounts previously
23 appropriated for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019,
24 \$83,668 is appropriated from the economic stabilization fund to the
25 University of Houston - Clear Lake for the two-year period
26 beginning on the effective date of this Act for expenses related to
27 Hurricane Harvey.

1 SECTION 23. LONE STAR COLLEGE SYSTEM: EXPENSES RELATED TO
2 HURRICANE HARVEY. In addition to amounts previously appropriated
3 for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$13,100,000
4 is appropriated from the economic stabilization fund to the Lone
5 Star College System for the two-year period beginning on the
6 effective date of this Act for expenses related to Hurricane
7 Harvey.

8 SECTION 24. TEXAS A&M FOREST SERVICE: EXPENSES RELATED TO
9 HURRICANE HARVEY. In addition to amounts previously appropriated
10 for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$2,458,240 is
11 appropriated from the economic stabilization fund to the Texas A&M
12 Forest Service for the state fiscal year ending August 31, 2019, for
13 expenses related to Hurricane Harvey.

14 SECTION 25. TEXAS A&M FOREST SERVICE: WILDFIRES. In
15 addition to amounts previously appropriated for the state fiscal
16 biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$54,909,580 is appropriated from
17 the economic stabilization fund to the Texas A&M Forest Service for
18 the state fiscal year ending August 31, 2019, for expenses related
19 to wildfires.

20 SECTION 26. DEPARTMENT OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE: REPLACEMENT OF
21 MONEY TRANSFERRED TO ADDRESS NEEDS RESULTING FROM HURRICANE HARVEY.
22 In addition to amounts previously appropriated for the state fiscal
23 biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$38,600,000 is appropriated from
24 the economic stabilization fund to the Department of Criminal
25 Justice for the state fiscal year ending August 31, 2019, for agency
26 operations expenses under Strategy C.1.1., Correctional Security
27 Operations, as listed in Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th

1 Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations
2 Act), to replace money transferred from that strategy to disaster
3 assistance programs to address needs resulting from Hurricane
4 Harvey.

5 SECTION 27. DEPARTMENT OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE: CORRECTIONAL
6 MANAGED HEALTH CARE. In addition to amounts previously
7 appropriated for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019,
8 \$160,000,000 is appropriated from the general revenue fund to the
9 Department of Criminal Justice for the state fiscal year ending
10 August 31, 2019, for correctional managed health care under
11 Strategy C.1.9., Hospital and Clinical Care, as listed in Chapter
12 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017
13 (the General Appropriations Act).

14 SECTION 28. DEPARTMENT OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE: CORRECTIONAL
15 OFFICER OVERTIME. In addition to amounts previously appropriated
16 for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$30,000,000
17 is appropriated from the general revenue fund to the Department of
18 Criminal Justice for the state fiscal year ending August 31, 2019,
19 for correctional officer overtime under Strategy C.1.1.,
20 Correctional Security Operations, as listed in Chapter 605 (S.B.
21 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the
22 General Appropriations Act).

23 SECTION 29. DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY: EXPENSES RELATED
24 TO HURRICANE HARVEY. In addition to amounts previously
25 appropriated for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019,
26 the following amounts are appropriated from the economic
27 stabilization fund to the Department of Public Safety for the state

1 fiscal year ending August 31, 2019, for the following strategies as
2 listed in Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature,
3 Regular Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act), for agency
4 operations expenses related to Hurricane Harvey:

- 5 (1) \$34,954,406 for Strategy A.1.1., Organized Crime;
- 6 (2) \$60,000,000 for Strategy C.1.1., Traffic
7 Enforcement; and
- 8 (3) \$2,000,000 for Strategy G.1.3., Information
9 Technology.

10 SECTION 29A. COMPTROLLER OF PUBLIC ACCOUNTS: TEXAS
11 INFRASTRUCTURE RESILIENCY FUND. Contingent on Senate Bill No. 7 or
12 similar legislation of the 86th Legislature, Regular Session, 2019,
13 relating to flood control planning and the funding of flood
14 planning, mitigation, and infrastructure projects becoming law, in
15 addition to amounts previously appropriated for the state fiscal
16 biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$1,650,000,000 is appropriated
17 from the economic stabilization fund to the comptroller of public
18 accounts for the state fiscal year ending August 31, 2019, for the
19 purpose of immediately depositing that amount to the credit of the
20 Texas infrastructure resiliency fund.

21 SECTION 30. TEXAS DIVISION OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT IN
22 DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY: MATCHING FUNDS FOR FEMA HAZARD
23 MITIGATION GRANT PROGRAM. (a) In addition to amounts previously
24 appropriated for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019,
25 \$275,000,000 is appropriated from the economic stabilization fund
26 to the Texas Division of Emergency Management in the Department of
27 Public Safety for the two-year period beginning on the effective

1 date of this Act for the purpose of providing matching funds for
2 projects sponsored by municipalities and counties in this state and
3 approved for the Hazard Mitigation Grant program administered by
4 the Federal Emergency Management Agency.

5 (b) Contingent on Senate Bill No. 7 or similar legislation
6 of the 86th Legislature, Regular Session, 2019, relating to flood
7 control planning and the funding of flood planning, mitigation, and
8 infrastructure projects becoming law:

9 (1) the appropriation of money made in Subsection (a)
10 of this section has no effect; and

11 (2) in addition to amounts previously appropriated for
12 the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$275,000,000 is
13 appropriated from the Texas infrastructure resiliency fund to the
14 Texas Division of Emergency Management in the Department of Public
15 Safety for the two-year period beginning on the effective date of
16 this Act for the purpose of providing matching funds for projects
17 sponsored by municipalities and counties in this state and approved
18 for the Hazard Mitigation Grant program administered by the Federal
19 Emergency Management Agency.

20 SECTION 31. TEXAS DIVISION OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT IN
21 DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY: MATCHING FUNDS FOR FEMA PUBLIC
22 ASSISTANCE GRANT PROGRAM. (a) In addition to amounts previously
23 appropriated for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019,
24 \$335,000,000 is appropriated from the economic stabilization fund
25 to the Texas Division of Emergency Management in the Department of
26 Public Safety for the two-year period beginning on the effective
27 date of this Act for the purpose of providing matching funds for

1 projects sponsored by municipalities and counties in this state and
2 approved for the Public Assistance grant program administered by
3 the Federal Emergency Management Agency.

4 (b) Contingent on Senate Bill No. 7 or similar legislation
5 of the 86th Legislature, Regular Session, 2019, relating to flood
6 control planning and the funding of flood planning, mitigation, and
7 infrastructure projects becoming law:

8 (1) the appropriation of money made in Subsection (a)
9 of this section has no effect; and

10 (2) in addition to amounts previously appropriated for
11 the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$335,000,000 is
12 appropriated from the Texas infrastructure resiliency fund to the
13 Texas Division of Emergency Management in the Department of Public
14 Safety for the two-year period beginning on the effective date of
15 this Act for the purpose of providing matching funds for projects
16 sponsored by municipalities and counties in this state and approved
17 for the Public Assistance grant program administered by the Federal
18 Emergency Management Agency.

19 SECTION 32. DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY: CRIME
20 LABORATORIES. In addition to amounts previously appropriated for
21 the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$5,770,426 is
22 appropriated from the general revenue fund to the Department of
23 Public Safety for the state fiscal year ending August 31, 2019, for
24 crime laboratory operations under Strategy E.1.1., Crime
25 Laboratory Services, as listed in Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the
26 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the General
27 Appropriations Act).

1 SECTION 33. GENERAL LAND OFFICE: EXPENSES RELATED TO
2 HURRICANE HARVEY. In addition to amounts previously appropriated
3 for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, the following
4 amounts are appropriated from the economic stabilization fund to
5 the General Land Office for the state fiscal year ending August 31,
6 2019, for the following strategies as listed in Chapter 605 (S.B.
7 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the
8 General Appropriations Act), to remove vessels and repair or
9 replace structures or equipment damaged by Hurricane Harvey:

- 10 (1) \$696,921 for Strategy A.2.1., Asset Management;
- 11 (2) \$20,459,797 for Strategy B.1.1., Coastal
12 Management;
- 13 (3) \$430,000 for Strategy B.1.2., Coastal Erosion
14 Control Grants; and
- 15 (4) \$2,047,454 for Strategy B.2.1., Oil Spill
16 Response.

17 SECTION 34. GENERAL LAND OFFICE: MATCHING FUNDS FOR U.S.
18 ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS PROGRAMS. (a) In addition to amounts
19 previously appropriated for the state fiscal biennium ending August
20 31, 2019, \$200,000,000 is appropriated from the economic
21 stabilization fund to the General Land Office for the two-year
22 period beginning on the effective date of this Act to provide state
23 matching funds to meet federal requirements for studies and
24 projects planned to be conducted in the state by the United States
25 Army Corps of Engineers.

26 (b) Contingent on Senate Bill No. 7 or similar legislation

15 Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act), to the bill pattern
16 of the appropriations to the Commission on Environmental Quality,
17 in addition to amounts previously appropriated for the state fiscal
18 biennium ending August 31, 2019, the commission is appropriated for
19 the state fiscal year ending August 31, 2019, all fee revenues
20 collected from expedited permit review surcharges assessed under
21 Section [382.05155](#), Health and Safety Code, and deposited to the
22 Clean Air Account No. 151 in excess of the estimated amount of those
23 revenues in the comptroller's biennial revenue estimate for the
24 state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, for costs incurred to
25 support the expedited processing of permit applications.

12 the Parks and Wildlife Department for the two-year period beginning
13 on the effective date of this Act for Strategy D.1.1., Improvements
14 and Major Repairs, as listed in Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the
15 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the General
16 Appropriations Act), to repair structures or equipment damaged by
17 Hurricane Harvey.

18 SECTION 38. PARKS AND WILDLIFE DEPARTMENT: REPLACEMENT OF
19 INOPERABLE RADIOS. In addition to amounts previously appropriated
20 for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$5,000,000 is
21 appropriated from the economic stabilization fund to the Parks and
22 Wildlife Department for the state fiscal year ending August 31,
23 2019, for the replacement of inoperable radios under Strategy
24 C.1.1., Enforcement Programs, as listed in Chapter 605 (S.B. 1),
25 Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the General
26 Appropriations Act).

27 SECTION 39. SOIL AND WATER CONSERVATION BOARD: DAM

1 INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS. In addition to amounts previously
2 appropriated for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019,
3 \$150,000,000 is appropriated from the economic stabilization fund
4 to the Soil and Water Conservation Board for the two-year period
5 beginning on the effective date of this Act for dam infrastructure
6 projects.

7 SECTION 40. WATER DEVELOPMENT BOARD: STATE FLOOD RISK
8 MAPS. (a) In addition to amounts previously appropriated for the
9 state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, and in addition to
10 other amounts appropriated by this Act, \$47,000,000 is appropriated
11 from the economic stabilization fund to the Water Development Board
12 for the two-year period beginning on the effective date of this Act
13 for developing or updating flood risk maps in the state, using
14 current data and technology standards, under Strategy A.4.1.,
15 Perform Community Assistance Related to NFIP, as listed in Chapter
16 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017
17 (the General Appropriations Act).

18 (b) Contingent on Senate Bill No. 7 or similar legislation
19 of the 86th Legislature, Regular Session, 2019, relating to flood
20 control planning and the funding of flood planning, mitigation, and
21 infrastructure projects becoming law:

22 (1) the appropriation of money made in Subsection (a)
23 of this section has no effect; and

24 (2) in addition to amounts previously appropriated for
25 the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, and in addition to

5 (b) Contingent on Senate Bill No. 7 or similar legislation
6 of the 86th Legislature, Regular Session, 2019, relating to flood
7 control planning and the funding of flood planning, mitigation, and
8 infrastructure projects becoming law:

9 (1) the appropriation of money made in Subsection (a)
10 of this section has no effect; and

11 (2) in addition to amounts previously appropriated for
12 the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, and in addition to
13 other amounts appropriated by this Act, the following amounts are
14 appropriated from the Texas infrastructure resiliency fund to the
15 Water Development Board for the two-year period beginning on the
16 effective date of this Act for the following strategies as listed in
17 Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular
18 Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act), for infrastructure

26 SECTION 42. TEXAS WORKFORCE COMMISSION: EXPENSES RELATED
27 TO HURRICANE HARVEY. In addition to amounts previously

1 appropriated for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019,
2 \$8,931,385 is appropriated from the economic stabilization fund to
3 the Texas Workforce Commission for the state fiscal year ending
4 August 31, 2019, for Strategy A.2.1., Vocational Rehabilitation, as
5 listed in Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature,
6 Regular Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act), for
7 vocational rehabilitation services expenses related to Hurricane
8 Harvey.

9 SECTION 43. REIMBURSEMENT TO ECONOMIC STABILIZATION FUND.

10 If any state agency or public institution of higher education
11 receives reimbursement from the federal government, an insurer, or
12 another source for an expenditure paid or reimbursed from money
13 appropriated from the economic stabilization fund by this Act:

14 (1) the agency or institution shall reimburse the
15 state in an amount equal to the lesser of the amount appropriated
16 under this Act and spent or reimbursed for that expenditure or the
17 amount reimbursed by the other source for that expenditure; and

18 (2) the comptroller of public accounts shall deposit
19 the amount of the reimbursement to the credit of the economic
20 stabilization fund.

21 SECTION 44. EFFECTIVE DATE. (a) Subject to Subsections
