

AN ACT

relating to making supplemental appropriations and reductions in appropriations and giving direction, including direction regarding reimbursement, and adjustment authority regarding appropriations.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. COMPTROLLER OF PUBLIC ACCOUNTS: TEXAS TOMORROW FUND. In addition to amounts previously appropriated for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, the amount necessary to fund the prepaid higher education tuition program described by Section 19, Article VII, Texas Constitution, for the two-year period beginning on the effective date of this Act (estimated to be \$210,981,159) is appropriated from the economic stabilization fund to the comptroller of public accounts for that period for the purpose of immediately depositing that amount in the Texas tomorrow fund created under that section.

SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION REDUCTION: FACILITIES COMMISSION. The unencumbered appropriations from the general revenue fund to the Facilities Commission made by Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act), for use during the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, for lease payments are reduced by \$22,589,128. The commission shall identify the strategies and objectives to which the reduction is to be allocated and the amount of the reduction for each of those strategies and objectives.

1 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION REDUCTION: PUBLIC FINANCE
2 AUTHORITY. The unencumbered appropriations from the general
3 revenue fund to the Public Finance Authority made by Chapter 605
4 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the
5 General Appropriations Act), for use during the state fiscal
6 biennium ending August 31, 2019, for bond debt service payments,
7 including appropriations subject to Rider 3, page I-48, Chapter 605
8 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the
9 General Appropriations Act), to the bill pattern of the
10 appropriations to the authority, are reduced by a total aggregate
11 of \$35,078,954. The authority shall identify the strategies and
12 objectives to which the reduction is to be allocated and the amount
13 of the reduction for each of those strategies and objectives.

14 SECTION 4. APPROPRIATION REDUCTION: OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY
15 GENERAL. (a) It is the intent of the legislature that the Texas
16 Child Support Enforcement System 2.0 project be canceled as of the
17 effective date of this Act.

18 (b) The unencumbered appropriations from the general
19 revenue fund to the Office of the Attorney General made by Chapter
20 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017
21 (the General Appropriations Act), for use during the state fiscal
22 biennium ending August 31, 2019, for Strategy B.1.1., Child Support
23 Enforcement, as listed in that Act, are reduced by \$21,799,752,
24 including \$11,370,987 from the Child Support Retained Collection
25 Account.

26 SECTION 5. TRUSTEED PROGRAMS WITHIN THE OFFICE OF THE
27 GOVERNOR: DISASTER GRANTS. In addition to amounts previously

1 appropriated for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019,
2 \$100,000,000 is appropriated from the economic stabilization fund
3 to the Trusteed Programs within the Office of the Governor for the
4 two-year period beginning on the effective date of this Act for
5 disaster grants under Strategy A.1.1., Disaster Funds, as listed in
6 Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular
7 Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act).

8 SECTION 6. LIBRARY AND ARCHIVES COMMISSION: ADDITIONAL
9 APPROPRIATIONS. In addition to amounts previously appropriated for
10 the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$4,400,000 is
11 appropriated from the general revenue fund to the Library and
12 Archives Commission for the two-year period beginning on the
13 effective date of this Act for renovating the Promontory Point
14 Drive facility in the City of Austin, Texas, for the storage of
15 public records.

16 SECTION 7. TEXAS HISTORICAL COMMISSION: NATIONAL MUSEUM OF
17 THE PACIFIC WAR. In addition to amounts previously appropriated
18 for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$2,149,600 is
19 appropriated from the economic stabilization fund to the Texas
20 Historical Commission for the two-year period beginning on the
21 effective date of this Act for capital projects at the National
22 Museum of the Pacific War under Strategy A.1.4., Historic Sites, as
23 listed in Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature,
24 Regular Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act), including:

25 (1) updates to the electrical, security, and heating,
26 ventilation, and air conditioning systems;

27 (2) projects to address accessibility issues;

1 (3) exterior, roofing, and structural repairs to the
2 Nimitz Barn maintenance area;

3 (4) refurbishment of the Bush Gallery to address wear
4 and tear from visitor volume; and

5 (5) technology upgrades to exhibits in the Bush
6 Gallery.

7 SECTION 8. TEXAS HISTORICAL COMMISSION: COURTHOUSE
8 PRESERVATION GRANTS. In addition to amounts previously
9 appropriated for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019,
10 \$25,000,000 is appropriated from the economic stabilization fund to
11 the Texas Historical Commission for the two-year period beginning
12 on the effective date of this Act for courthouse preservation
13 grants under Strategy A.1.3., Courthouse Preservation, as listed in
14 Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular
15 Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act).

16 SECTION 9. TEXAS HISTORICAL COMMISSION: DEFERRED
17 MAINTENANCE. In addition to amounts previously appropriated for
18 the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, and in addition to
19 other amounts appropriated by this Act, the following amounts are
20 appropriated from the economic stabilization fund to the Texas
21 Historical Commission for the two-year period beginning on the
22 effective date of this Act for the following strategies as listed in
23 Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular
24 Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act), for deferred
25 maintenance projects:

26 (1) \$300,000 for Strategy A.1.1., Architectural
27 Assistance; and

1 (2) \$2,586,250 for Strategy A.1.4., Historic Sites.

2 SECTION 10. TEXAS HISTORICAL COMMISSION: LEVI JORDAN
3 PLANTATION. In addition to amounts previously appropriated for the
4 state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, and in addition to
5 other amounts appropriated by this Act, \$2,000,000 is appropriated
6 from the economic stabilization fund to the Texas Historical
7 Commission for the two-year period beginning on the effective date
8 of this Act for historic site planning at the Levi Jordan
9 Plantation, including architectural, engineering, interpretive,
10 and site survey services and collections conservation and
11 acquisition to develop museum exhibits, under Strategy A.1.4.,
12 Historic Sites, as listed in Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th
13 Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations
14 Act).

15 SECTION 11. DEPARTMENT OF FAMILY AND PROTECTIVE SERVICES:
16 FOSTER CARE. In addition to amounts previously appropriated for
17 the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$88,585,541 is
18 appropriated from the general revenue fund to the Department of
19 Family and Protective Services for the state fiscal year ending
20 August 31, 2019, for foster care payments under Strategy B.1.9.,
21 Foster Care Payments, as listed in Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the
22 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the General
23 Appropriations Act).

24 SECTION 12. DEPARTMENT OF FAMILY AND PROTECTIVE SERVICES:
25 RELATIVE CAREGIVER PAYMENTS. (a) In addition to amounts
26 previously appropriated for the state fiscal biennium ending August
27 31, 2019, \$6,833,593 is appropriated from the general revenue fund

1 to the Department of Family and Protective Services for the state
2 fiscal year ending August 31, 2019, for relative caregiver payments
3 under Strategy B.1.11., Relative Caregiver Payments, as listed in
4 Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular
5 Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act).

6 (b) The unencumbered appropriations from federal Temporary
7 Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) funds to the Department of
8 Family and Protective Services made by Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of
9 the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the General
10 Appropriations Act), for use during the state fiscal biennium
11 ending August 31, 2019, for relative caregiver payments under
12 Strategy B.1.11., Relative Caregiver Payments, as listed in that
13 Act, are reduced by \$8,481,040.

14 SECTION 13. DEPARTMENT OF FAMILY AND PROTECTIVE SERVICES:
15 DAY CARE. In addition to amounts previously appropriated for the
16 state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$5,000,000 is
17 appropriated from federal Child Care and Development Block Grant
18 funds to the Department of Family and Protective Services for the
19 state fiscal year ending August 31, 2019, for day care payments
20 under Strategy B.1.3., TWC Contracted Day Care, as listed in
21 Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular
22 Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act).

23 SECTION 14. DEPARTMENT OF FAMILY AND PROTECTIVE SERVICES:
24 PURCHASED CLIENT SERVICES. In addition to amounts previously
25 appropriated for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019,
26 the following amounts are appropriated from the general revenue
27 fund to the Department of Family and Protective Services for the

1 state fiscal year ending August 31, 2019, for the following
2 strategies as listed in Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th
3 Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations
4 Act), for purchased client services:

5 (1) \$4,908,619 for Strategy B.1.4., Adoption
6 Purchased Services;

7 (2) \$10,550,475 for Strategy B.1.7., Substance Abuse
8 Purchased Services; and

9 (3) \$5,792,750 for Strategy B.1.8., Other CPS
10 Purchased Services.

11 SECTION 15. DEPARTMENT OF STATE HEALTH SERVICES: X-ALD
12 NEWBORN SCREENING. In addition to amounts previously appropriated
13 for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$7,927,458 is
14 appropriated from the general revenue fund to the Department of
15 State Health Services for the two-year period beginning on the
16 effective date of this Act for screening newborns for X-linked
17 adrenoleukodystrophy (X-ALD) under Strategy A.4.1., Laboratory
18 Services, as listed in Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th
19 Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations
20 Act).

21 SECTION 16. DEPARTMENT OF STATE HEALTH SERVICES: EMERGENCY
22 GENERATOR. In addition to amounts previously appropriated for the
23 state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$12,000,000 is
24 appropriated from the economic stabilization fund to the Department
25 of State Health Services for the two-year period beginning on the
26 effective date of this Act for an emergency generator for the Austin
27 laboratory to continue laboratory functions during a power outage

1 under Strategy A.4.1., Laboratory Services, as listed in Chapter
2 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017
3 (the General Appropriations Act).

4 SECTION 17. DEPARTMENT OF STATE HEALTH SERVICES: TRAUMA
5 CAPACITY AND RESPONSE INFRASTRUCTURE. (a) In addition to amounts
6 previously appropriated for the state fiscal biennium ending August
7 31, 2019, \$17,000,000 is appropriated from the economic
8 stabilization fund to the Department of State Health Services for
9 the two-year period beginning on the effective date of this Act for
10 increasing trauma capacity and improving related trauma response
11 infrastructure under Strategy B.2.1., EMS and Trauma Care Systems,
12 as listed in Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature,
13 Regular Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act).

14 (b) Of the amount appropriated under Subsection (a) of this
15 section, \$2,000,000 may be used only to provide funding in
16 accordance with Section 780.004, Health and Safety Code, to trauma
17 service area regional advisory councils for improving emergency
18 management services.

19 (c) Of the amount appropriated under Subsection (a) of this
20 section, \$15,000,000 may be used only to provide funding in
21 accordance with Section 780.004, Health and Safety Code, to
22 hospitals that demonstrate regional need and the ability to
23 efficiently and effectively increase trauma capacity and improve
24 related trauma response infrastructure. The Department of State
25 Health Services shall allocate:

26 (1) at least 40 percent of that amount to provide
27 funding to hospitals in the Rio Grande Valley, prioritizing, to the

1 extent consistent with general law, primary teaching hospitals in
2 that region with a general surgery residency program pursuing
3 designation as a level I trauma facility; and

4 (2) not more than 40 percent of that amount to provide
5 funding to hospitals located in a region directly affected by
6 Hurricane Harvey.

7 (d) Any funding provided to an entity under Subsection (b)
8 or (c) of this section that is not spent for the purpose for which
9 the funding was provided must be returned to the state.

10 (e) The unexpended balance of money allocated as provided by
11 Subsection (b) or (c) of this section as of August 31, 2020, is
12 appropriated to the Department of State Health Services for the
13 state fiscal year ending August 31, 2021, for the purpose for which
14 it was allocated.

15 SECTION 18. HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES COMMISSION: MEDICAID
16 SHORTFALL. (a) In addition to amounts previously appropriated for
17 the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$2,000,000,000 is
18 appropriated from the general revenue fund, and \$2,150,000,000 is
19 appropriated from federal funds, to the Health and Human Services
20 Commission for the state fiscal year ending August 31, 2019, for
21 Medicaid client services under Goal A, Medicaid Client Services, as
22 listed in Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature,
23 Regular Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act).

24 (b) Of the amounts appropriated under Subsection (a) of this
25 section, the Health and Human Services Commission shall transfer
26 the following amounts from Goal A, Medicaid Client Services, to the
27 following strategies as listed in Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the

1 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the General
2 Appropriations Act):

3 (1) \$5,500,000 to Strategy D.2.3., Community Mental
4 Health Crisis Services; and

5 (2) \$2,000,000 to Strategy D.2.2., Community Mental
6 Health Services - Children.

7 SECTION 19. HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES COMMISSION: RATE
8 INCREASE FOR CHILDREN'S HOSPITALS. In addition to amounts
9 previously appropriated for the state fiscal biennium ending August
10 31, 2019, \$50,000,000 is appropriated from the general revenue fund
11 to the Health and Human Services Commission for the two-year period
12 beginning on the effective date of this Act for a rate increase for
13 children's hospitals under Strategy A.1.5., Children, as listed in
14 Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular
15 Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act).

16 SECTION 20. HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES COMMISSION:
17 REPLACEMENT OF MONEY TRANSFERRED TO ADDRESS NEEDS RESULTING FROM
18 HURRICANE HARVEY. In addition to amounts previously appropriated
19 for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$110,000,000
20 is appropriated from the economic stabilization fund to the Health
21 and Human Services Commission for the state fiscal year ending
22 August 31, 2019, for Medicaid client services under Strategy
23 A.1.5., Children, as listed in Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the
24 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the General
25 Appropriations Act), to replace money transferred from that
26 strategy to disaster assistance programs to address needs resulting
27 from Hurricane Harvey.

1 SECTION 21. HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES COMMISSION: STATE
2 HOSPITAL CONSTRUCTION. In addition to amounts previously
3 appropriated for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019,
4 \$445,354,363 is appropriated from the economic stabilization fund
5 to the Health and Human Services Commission for the two-year period
6 beginning on the effective date of this Act for continuing
7 improvements to state hospital facilities under Strategy G.4.2.,
8 Facility Capital Repairs and Renovations, as listed in Chapter 605
9 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the
10 General Appropriations Act), as follows:

11 (1) \$90,054,363 for construction of a 100-bed
12 non-maximum security unit at Rusk State Hospital;

13 (2) \$165,000,000 to begin construction of a 240-bed
14 replacement campus of Austin State Hospital; and

15 (3) \$190,300,000 to begin construction of a 300-bed
16 replacement campus of San Antonio State Hospital.

17 SECTION 22. APPROPRIATION REDUCTION: HEALTH AND HUMAN
18 SERVICES COMMISSION. The unencumbered appropriations from the
19 economic stabilization fund to the Health and Human Services
20 Commission made by Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th
21 Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations
22 Act), for use during the state fiscal biennium ending August 31,
23 2019, for Strategy G.4.2., Facility Capital Repairs and
24 Renovations, as listed in that Act, and subject to Rider 221(b),
25 page II-111, Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature,
26 Regular Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act), to the bill
27 pattern of the appropriations to the commission, are reduced by

1 \$2,000,000.

2 SECTION 23. HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES COMMISSION: CERTAIN
3 TRANSFERS. From amounts previously appropriated for the state
4 fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, the Health and Human
5 Services Commission shall transfer \$6,154,893 from Goal A, Medicaid
6 Client Services, to Strategy B.1.1., Medicaid Contracts and
7 Administration, as listed in Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th
8 Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations
9 Act), for use for contingency contracts.

10 SECTION 24. HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES COMMISSION: HEALTHY
11 TEXAS WOMEN PROGRAM SHORTFALL. In addition to amounts previously
12 appropriated for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019,
13 \$10,300,000 is appropriated from the general revenue fund to the
14 Health and Human Services Commission for the state fiscal year
15 ending August 31, 2019, for the Healthy Texas Women program under
16 Strategy D.1.1., Women's Health Program, as listed in Chapter 605
17 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the
18 General Appropriations Act).

19 SECTION 25. HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES COMMISSION: MENTAL
20 HEALTH STATE HOSPITALS. In addition to amounts previously
21 appropriated for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019,
22 \$31,700,000 is appropriated from the general revenue fund to the
23 Health and Human Services Commission for the state fiscal year
24 ending August 31, 2019, for mental health state hospital services
25 under Strategy G.2.1., Mental Health State Hospitals, as listed in
26 Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular
27 Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act).

1 SECTION 26. HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES COMMISSION: EARLY
2 CHILDHOOD INTERVENTION. In addition to amounts previously
3 appropriated for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019,
4 \$1,500,000 is appropriated from the general revenue fund to the
5 Health and Human Services Commission for the state fiscal year
6 ending August 31, 2019, for early childhood intervention under
7 Strategy D.1.3., Early Childhood Intervention Services, as listed
8 in Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular
9 Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act).

10 SECTION 27. HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES COMMISSION: STATE
11 SUPPORTED LIVING CENTERS. In addition to amounts previously
12 appropriated for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019,
13 \$10,100,000 is appropriated from the general revenue fund to the
14 Health and Human Services Commission for the state fiscal year
15 ending August 31, 2019, for state supported living centers under
16 Strategy G.1.1., State Supported Living Centers, as listed in
17 Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular
18 Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act).

19 SECTION 28. HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES COMMISSION: REPURPOSE
20 OF EXPENDITURE OF FUNDS. Notwithstanding Section 20 of the Special
21 Provisions Relating to All Health and Human Services Agencies, page
22 II-124, Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular
23 Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act), the Health and
24 Human Services Commission may use \$63,832,747 of the amount
25 appropriated under that Act to the commission for Goal A, Medicaid
26 Client Services, as listed in that Act and designated under that
27 rider for use only for the health insurance providers fee, for

1 Medicaid client services.

2 SECTION 29. APPROPRIATION REDUCTION: TEXAS EDUCATION
3 AGENCY; SUM-CERTAIN APPROPRIATION FOR FOUNDATION SCHOOL PROGRAM.

4 (a) The unencumbered appropriations from the Foundation School
5 Fund, general revenue account number 0193, to the Texas Education
6 Agency made by Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature,
7 Regular Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act), for use
8 during the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, for
9 Strategy A.1.1., FSP - Equalized Operations, as listed in that Act,
10 are reduced by \$903,300,000.

11 (b) Notwithstanding Rider 3, page III-5, Chapter 605 (S.B.
12 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017 (the
13 General Appropriations Act), to the bill pattern of the
14 appropriations to the Texas Education Agency, the sum-certain
15 appropriation to the Foundation School Program for the state fiscal
16 year ending August 31, 2019, is \$21,495,735,602.

17 SECTION 30. TEXAS EDUCATION AGENCY: SPECIAL EDUCATION
18 SUPPORTS AND MAINTENANCE OF STATE FINANCIAL SUPPORT FOR SPECIAL
19 EDUCATION. (a) In addition to amounts previously appropriated for
20 the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, the following
21 amounts are appropriated from the general revenue fund to the Texas
22 Education Agency for the two-year period beginning on the effective
23 date of this Act for the following purposes:

24 (1) \$33,302,428 to offset federal funds withheld or
25 expected to be withheld as a result of a failure to maintain state
26 financial support for special education under 20 U.S.C. Section
27 1412(a)(18) during the state fiscal year ending August 31, 2012;

1 (2) \$74,626,551 to negotiate a settlement agreement
2 with the federal government to prevent the withholding of federal
3 funds as a result of a failure to maintain state financial support
4 for special education under 20 U.S.C. Section 1412(a)(18) during
5 the state fiscal years ending August 31, 2017 (estimated to be
6 \$41,594,326), and August 31, 2018 (estimated to be \$33,032,225);
7 and

8 (3) \$111,625,833 for the following strategies as
9 listed in Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature,
10 Regular Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act), to prevent
11 a failure to maintain state financial support for special education
12 under 20 U.S.C. Section 1412(a)(18) during the state fiscal year
13 ending August 31, 2019:

14 (A) \$50,000,000 for Strategy A.2.3., Students
15 with Disabilities, for grants to reimburse school districts for:

16 (i) providing extended school year services
17 to students enrolled in a special education program under
18 Subchapter A, Chapter 29, Education Code;

19 (ii) costs related to identification of
20 students eligible to participate in a school district's special
21 education program under Section 29.003, Education Code, including
22 full individual and initial evaluations and independent education
23 evaluations; and

24 (iii) compensatory services costs related
25 to the provision of services to students under the Individuals with
26 Disabilities Education Act (20 U.S.C. Section 1400 et seq.);

27 (B) \$478,500 for information technology needs

1 related to special education supports under Strategy B.3.5.,
2 Information Systems - Technology; and

3 (C) \$61,147,333 for special education funding
4 under Strategy A.1.1., FSP - Equalized Operations.

5 (b) The amount appropriated under Subsection (a)(1) of this
6 section must be used in the same manner and for the same purposes as
7 the withheld federal funds would have been provided.

8 (c) The amounts appropriated under Subsections (a)(2) and
9 (3)(C) of this section must be used to provide funding for public
10 schools under Strategy A.1.1., FSP - Equalized Operations, as
11 listed in Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature,
12 Regular Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act), to be
13 distributed for each full-time equivalent student in average daily
14 attendance in a special education program under Subchapter A,
15 Chapter 29, Education Code, in proportion to the applicable weight
16 for the student under the public school finance system.

17 (d) Not later than December 31, 2020, the Texas Education
18 Agency shall report to the Legislative Budget Board and the office
19 of the governor regarding the use of funds appropriated under
20 Subsection (a)(3)(A) of this section.

21 SECTION 31. TEXAS EDUCATION AGENCY: POST-DISASTER SCHOOL

15 in addition to amounts previously appropriated for the state fiscal
16 biennium ending August 31, 2019, the following amounts are
17 appropriated from the economic stabilization fund to the Parks and
18 Wildlife Department for the two-year period beginning on the
19 effective date of this Act for the following strategies as listed in
20 Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular
21 Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act), for the Battleship
22 "Texas":

12 appropriated from the economic stabilization fund to the Texas
13 Workforce Commission for the state fiscal year ending August 31,
14 2019, for Strategy A.2.1., Vocational Rehabilitation, as listed in
15 Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature, Regular
16 Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act), for vocational
17 rehabilitation services expenses related to Hurricane Harvey.

18 SECTION 82. BOARD OF PHARMACY: PRESCRIPTION MONITORING
19 PROGRAM. In addition to amounts previously appropriated for the
20 state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$6,099,312 is
21 appropriated from the general revenue fund to the Board of Pharmacy
22 for the two-year period beginning on the effective date of this Act
23 for statewide integration of and upgrades to the prescription
24 monitoring program database under Strategy B.1.1., Enforcement, as
25 listed in Chapter 605 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 85th Legislature,
26 Regular Session, 2017 (the General Appropriations Act).

27 SECTION 83. TEACHER RETIREMENT SYSTEM: ADDITIONAL PAYMENT.

4 in addition to amounts previously appropriated for the state fiscal
5 biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$589,000,000 is appropriated from
6 the economic stabilization fund to the Teacher Retirement System
7 for the two-year period beginning on the effective date of this Act
8 for the purpose of providing a one-time additional payment to
9 certain annuitants.

13 (b) and (c) of this section, this Act takes effect immediately.

21 (c) Section 45 of this Act takes effect only if this Act
