16 of \$35,078,954. The authority shall identify the strategies and

17 objectives to which the reduction is to be allocated and the amount

18 of the reduction for each of those strategies and objectives.

- 16 purpose of providing a one-time additional payment to certain

- 18 SECTION 66. TEACHER RETIREMENT SYSTEM: STATE CONTRIBUTION.
- 19 Contingent on House Bill No. 9 or similar legislation of the 86th
- 20 Legislature, Regular Session, 2019, relating to the contributions
- 21 and benefits under the Teacher Retirement System becoming law, in
- 22 addition to amounts previously appropriated for the state fiscal
- 23 biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$684,000,000 is appropriated from
- 24 the general revenue fund to the Teacher Retirement System for the
- 25 state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2021, for the purpose of
- 26 immediately depositing that amount as a state contribution in the
- 27 Teacher Retirement System Trust Account number 0960.

- 1 SECTION 67. EMPLOYEES RETIREMENT SYSTEM: STATE
- 2 CONTRIBUTION. In addition to amounts previously appropriated for
- 3 the state fiscal biennium ending August 31, 2019, \$148,725,414 is
- 4 appropriated from the general revenue fund to the Employees
- 5 Retirement System for the state fiscal biennium ending August 31,
- 6 2021, for the purpose of immediately depositing that amount as a
- 7 state contribution in the State Employee Retirement System Trust
- 8 Account number 0955.
- 9 SECTION 68. REIMBURSEMENT TO ECONOMIC STABILIZATION FUND.
- 10 If any state agency or public institution of higher education
- 11 receives reimbursement from the federal government, an insurer, or
- 12 another source for an expenditure paid from money appropriated by
- 13 this Act:
- 14 (1) the agency or institution shall reimburse the
- 15 state in an amount equal to the lesser of the amount appropriated
- 16 under this Act and spent for that expenditure or the amount
- 17 reimbursed by the other source for that expenditure; and
- 18 (2) the comptroller of public accounts shall deposit
- 19 the amount of the reimbursement to the credit of the economic
