4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 28, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 28.0091 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 28.0091. STUDY OF COSTS OF DUAL CREDIT COURSES. (a)
8	The agency shall conduct a study to examine costs associated with
9	dual credit courses offered at public high schools. In conducting
10	the study, the agency shall:
11	(1) collect data relating to costs associated with
12	dual credit courses, including tuition and fees, from:
13	(A) school districts;
14	(B) the Texas Higher Education Coordinating
15	Board;
16	(C) public junior and community colleges;
17	(D) the Texas State Technical College System; and
18	(E) general academic teaching institutions;
19	(2) identify the sources of funding for dual credit
20	courses and the amount funded by each source; and
21	(3) determine the manner in which funds under
22	Subdivision (2) are being used for dual credit courses.
23	(b) Not later than September 1, 2020, the agency shall
24	prepare a report detailing the results of the study under this

- 2 committee with primary jurisdiction over secondary and higher
- 3 <u>education</u>.
- 4 (c) This section expires September 1, 2021.
- 5 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 6 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 7 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 8 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 9 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
