A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the issuance of a driver's license or personal
3	identification certificate to a youth experiencing homelessness.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter R, Chapter 521, Transportation Code,
6	is amended by adding Section 521.4265 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 521.4265. EXEMPTION FOR YOUTH EXPERIENCING
8	HOMELESSNESS. (a) In this section, "youth experiencing
9	homelessness":
10	(1) means an individual who is at least 16 years of age
11	and not older than 24 years of age and:
12	(A) lacks a fixed, regular, and adequate
13	nighttime residence; or
14	(B) has a primary nighttime residence that is:
15	(i) a supervised publicly or privately
16	operated shelter designed to provide temporary living
17	accommodations, including welfare hotels, congregate shelters, and
18	transitional housing for the mentally ill;
19	(ii) an institution that provides a
20	temporary residence for individuals intended to be
21	institutionalized; or
22	(iii) a public or private place not
23	designed for, or ordinarily used as, a regular sleeping
24	accommodation for human beings; and

- 1 (2) does not include an individual who is imprisoned
- 2 or otherwise detained in a correctional facility at the time an
- 3 application is submitted for a driver's license or personal
- 4 identification certificate.
- 5 (b) Except as provided by Subsections (f) and (i), a youth
- 6 experiencing homelessness is entitled to an exemption from the
- 7 payment of fees under this chapter for the issuance of a driver's
- 8 license or personal identification certificate.
- 9 (c) For the purposes of this section, a person's status as a
- 10 youth experiencing homelessness must be confirmed by a notarized
- 11 affidavit from:
- 12 (1) a case manager employed by:
- (A) a homeless shelter or transitional housing
- 14 facility;
- 15 (B) an organization that provides to youth
- 16 experiencing homelessness or assists youth experiencing
- 17 homelessness in obtaining services such as health services, mental
- 18 or behavioral health services, substance abuse services, public
- 19 assistance services, or employment services; or
- 20 (C) a faith-based organization that provides
- 21 benefits or services to youth experiencing homelessness;
- 22 (2) a peace officer who is an official homeless
- 23 liaison; or
- 24 (3) a counselor or administrator at a school attended
- 25 by the youth experiencing homelessness.
- 26 (d) A person may not charge a fee for the affidavit
- 27 described by Subsection (c).

- 1 (e) An affidavit described by Subsection (c) may not be used
- 2 for a driver's license or personal identification certificate
- 3 application if the affidavit was signed more than 60 days before the
- 4 date the application is submitted.
- 5 (f) Subsection (b) does not apply to a person subject to the
- 6 registration requirements of Chapter 62, Code of Criminal
- 7 Procedure.
- 8 (g) For each exemption granted under this section the
- 9 department shall deposit to the credit of the Texas mobility fund an
- 10 amount from the identification fee exemption account under
- 11 Subsection (h) that is equal to the amount of the waived fee that
- 12 would otherwise be deposited to the mobility fund.
- 13 (h) The identification fee exemption account is created as
- 14 an account in the general revenue fund of the state treasury. The
- 15 fund consists of grants and donations made to the department for the
- 16 purposes of this section. The department shall administer the
- 17 account. Money in the account may be appropriated for the purposes
- 18 of Subsection (g).
- 19 (i) The department may not grant an exemption under this
- 20 section if money is not available in the identification fee
- 21 exemption account to meet the requirements of Subsection (g).
- 22 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
