2	relating to the regulation of listed family homes.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 42.042, Human Resources Code, is amended
5	by adding Subsection (d-1) and amending Subsection (g) to read as
6	follows:
7	(d-1) The executive commissioner by rule shall adopt
8	minimum standards for listed family homes. The minimum standards
9	<u>must:</u>
10	(1) promote the health, safety, and welfare of
11	children attending a listed family home;
12	(2) promote safe, comfortable, and healthy listed
13	family homes for children;
14	(3) ensure adequate supervision of children by
15	capable, qualified, and healthy personnel; and
16	(4) ensure medication is administered in accordance
17	with Section 42.065.
18	(g) In promulgating minimum standards the executive
19	commissioner may recognize and treat differently the types of
20	services provided by the following:
21	(1) <u>listed family homes;</u>
22	<pre>(2) registered family homes;</pre>
23	(3) [(2)] child-care facilities, including general
24	residential operations, cottage home operations, specialized

1 child-care homes, group day-care homes, and day-care centers;

(4) [(3)] child-placing agencies;

3 (5) [(4)] agency foster homes;

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4 (6) [(5)] continuum-of-care residential operations;

5 <u>(7)</u> [(6)] before-school or after-school programs; and

6 (8) [(7)] school-age programs.

7 SECTION 2. Sections 42.044(a) and (c), Human Resources
8 Code, are amended to read as follows:

9 (a) An authorized representative of the <u>commission</u> 10 [department] may visit a facility regulated under this chapter or a 11 registered <u>or listed</u> family home during operating hours to 12 investigate, inspect, and evaluate.

13 (c) The commission [department] must investigate a facility regulated under this chapter or a registered or listed family home 14 15 when a complaint is received by the commission. The representative 16 of the <u>commission</u> [department] must notify the operator of a registered or listed family home or the director or authorized 17 representative of a regulated facility when a complaint is being 18 investigated and report in writing the results of the investigation 19 to the family home's operator or to the regulated facility's 20 director or the director's authorized representative. 21

22 SECTION 3. Section 42.04425, Human Resources Code, is 23 amended by adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:

24 (d) The commission shall provide with the inspection data
 25 described by Subsection (c) a minimum of five years of
 26 investigative data for listed family homes regulated under this
 27 chapter to enhance consumer choice with respect to those homes.

1 SECTION 4. Section 42.0446, Human Resources Code, is
2 amended to read as follows:

Sec. 42.0446. REMOVAL OF CERTAIN INVESTIGATION INFORMATION 3 FROM INTERNET WEBSITE. 4 The executive commissioner shall adopt rules providing a procedure by which the commission [department] 5 removes from the commission's [department's] Internet website 6 7 information on [with respect to] a child-care facility or registered or listed family home that relates to an anonymous 8 9 complaint alleging [that] the facility or family home failed to comply with the commission's [department's] minimum standards if, 10 11 at the conclusion of an investigation, the <u>commission</u> [department] determines [that] the complaint is false or lacks factual 12 13 foundation.

SECTION 5. Section 42.0447(a), Human Resources Code, is amended to read as follows:

16 (a) A person commits an offense if the person knowingly or 17 intentionally files a complaint alleging that a child-care facility 18 or registered <u>or listed</u> family home failed to comply with the 19 <u>commission's</u> [department's] minimum standards and the person knows 20 the allegation is false or lacks factual foundation.

21 SECTION 6. Section 42.046, Human Resources Code, is amended
22 by adding Subsection (f) to read as follows:

23 (f) An applicant for a listing to operate a family home 24 shall submit with the application proof of the applicant's 25 successful completion of safe sleep training in accordance with 26 commission rules.

27 SECTION 7. Subchapter C, Chapter 42, Human Resources Code,

1 is amended by adding Section 42.0495 to read as follows:

<u>Sec. 42.0495. LIABILITY INSURANCE REQUIRED FOR LISTED</u>
<u>FAMILY HOMES. (a) A listed family home shall maintain liability</u>
<u>insurance coverage in the amount of \$300,000 for each occurrence of</u>
<u>negligence. An insurance policy or contract required under this</u>
<u>section must cover injury to a child that occurs while the child is</u>
<u>on the premises of or in the care of the listed family home.</u>

8 (b) A listed family home shall annually file with the 9 commission a certificate or other evidence of coverage from an 10 insurance company demonstrating that the listed family home has an 11 unexpired and uncanceled insurance policy or contract that meets 12 the requirements of this section.

13 (c) If a listed family home is unable to secure a policy or 14 contract required under this section for financial reasons or for 15 lack of availability of an underwriter willing to issue a policy or 16 contract or the home's policy or contract limits are exhausted, the 17 home shall timely provide written notice to the parent or guardian 18 of each child attending the home that the liability coverage is not 19 provided.

20 (d) A listed family home described by Subsection (c) shall 21 timely provide written notice to the commission that the home is 22 unable to secure liability insurance and the reason the insurance 23 could not be secured.

(e) If a listed family home complies with the notice
 requirements under this section, the commission may not assess an
 administrative penalty or suspend or revoke the family home's
 listing for violating Subsection (a). This subsection may not be

1 construed to indemnify a family home for damages due to negligence.

2 SECTION 8. Sections 42.052(f) and (i), Human Resources 3 Code, are amended to read as follows:

(f) To remain listed or registered with the <u>commission</u>
[department], a family home must comply with the <u>commission's</u>
[department's] rules and standards[, if applicable,] and any
provision of this chapter that applies to a listed or registered
family home.

9 (i) The commission [department] shall provide to a listed family home a copy of the listing. A listing must contain a 10 provision that states: "THIS HOME IS A LISTED FAMILY HOME. 11 IT IS NOT LICENSED OR REGISTERED WITH THE HEALTH AND HUMAN [DEPARTMENT OF 12 FAMILY AND PROTECTIVE] SERVICES COMMISSION. A LISTED FAMILY HOME 13 HAS LIMITED MINIMUM STANDARDS AND IS NOT [IT HAS NOT BEEN INSPECTED 14 AND WILL NOT BE] INSPECTED UNLESS A COMPLAINT IS FILED WITH THE 15 <u>COMMISSION</u>." The operator of a listed <u>family</u> home is not required 16 to display the listing in a prominent place at the home but shall 17 make the listing available for examination. [The executive 18 commissioner by rule shall provide for a sufficient period to allow 19 operators of family homes to comply with the listing requirement of 20 this section.] 21

SECTION 9. Section 42.0522(b), Human Resources Code, is amended to read as follows:

(b) A family home may not place a public advertisement that uses the title "listed family home" or any variation of that phrase unless the home is listed as provided by this chapter. Any public advertisement for a listed family home that uses the title "listed

family home" must contain a provision in bold type stating: "THIS 1 2 HOME IS A LISTED FAMILY HOME. IT IS NOT LICENSED OR REGISTERED WITH THE HEALTH AND HUMAN [DEPARTMENT OF FAMILY AND PROTECTIVE] SERVICES 3 4 COMMISSION. A LISTED FAMILY HOME HAS LIMITED MINIMUM STANDARDS AND IS NOT [IT HAS NOT BEEN INSPECTED AND WILL NOT BE] INSPECTED UNLESS 5 A COMPLAINT IS FILED WITH THE COMMISSION." 6 7 SECTION 10. Section 42.0523, Human Resources Code, is amended by adding Subsection (e) to read as follows: 8 9 (e) The following requirements do not apply to a family home listed under this section: 10 11 (1) the minimum standards adopted under Section 42.042; and 12 13 (2) the liability insurance requirement under Section 14 42.0495. 15 SECTION 11. Sections 42.044(c-1) and (c-2), Human Resources 16 Code, are repealed. 17 SECTION 12. As soon as practicable after the effective date 18 of this Act, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission shall adopt rules necessary to implement 19 20 Chapter 42, Human Resources Code, as amended by this Act. SECTION 13. The Health and Human Services Commission is 21 required to implement a provision of this Act only if the 22 legislature appropriates money specifically for that purpose. 23 Ιf 24 the legislature does not appropriate money specifically for that 25 purpose, the commission may, but is not required to, implement a provision of this Act using other appropriations available for that 26 27 purpose.
