21	PRODUCTS. (a) A cottage food production operation producing a
22	fermented product or a canned good that is acidified or low acid
23	shall, before making the product or good available for sale:
24	(1) submit to the department the recipe and a
25	description of the process used to produce the product or good; and
26	(2) obtain department approval to sell the product or
27	good.

- 1 (b) A recipe submitted to the department under this section
- 2 is a trade secret for purposes of Section 552.110, Government Code,
- 3 and is exempt from disclosure under Chapter 552, Government Code.
- 4 Sec. 437.01952. STUDY ON COMPETITIVENESS OF STATE'S COTTAGE
- 5 FOOD INDUSTRY. (a) The department, using existing resources,
- 6 shall study the competitiveness of this state's cottage food
- 7 industry. The <u>study must:</u>
- 8 (1) compare this state's cottage food industry laws to
- 9 the industry-related laws enacted by each state of the United
- 10 States; and
- 11 (2) determine:
- 12 (A) the specific areas in which this state's
- 13 cottage food industry laws are more or less restrictive than other
- 14 states' laws; and
- 15 (B) the effect of this state's laws on the
- 16 competitiveness of this state's cottage food industry.
- 17 (b) Not later than December 1, 2020, the department shall
- 18 submit to the legislature a report that includes the findings of the
- 19 study conducted under this section and the department's
- 20 recommendations for increasing the competitiveness of this state's
- 21 cottage food industry.
- (c) This section expires September 1, 2021.
- SECTION 3. Not later than January 1, 2020, the executive
- 24 commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission shall
- 25 adopt rules to implement Section 437.01951, Health and Safety Code,
- 26 as added by this Act.
- 27 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
