2	relating to the creation of a business advisory council on disaster
3	recovery and mitigation.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 31, Natural Resources
6	Code, is amended by adding Section 31.069 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 31.069. BUSINESS ADVISORY COUNCIL ON DISASTER RECOVERY
8	AND MITIGATION. (a) In this section:
9	(1) "Advisory council" means the business advisory
10	council on disaster recovery and mitigation established under this
11	section.
12	(2) "Disaster" has the meaning assigned by Section
13	418.004, Government Code.
14	(b) The business advisory council on disaster recovery and
15	mitigation is established to provide to the commissioner advice and
16	expertise on disaster recovery and mitigation as described by
17	Subsection (g).
18	(c) The advisory council is composed of six representatives
19	appointed by the commissioner as follows:
20	(1) one member representing banking and insurance
21	entities in this state that provide mortgage lending and insurance
22	for homeowners and businesses;
23	(2) one member representing construction entities in
24	this state engaged in the construction of commercial, industrial,

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1 and residential buildings; 2 (3) one member representing the manufacturers in this 3 state that produce construction materials; 4 (4) one member representing the oil and gas refiners 5 and processing industries having major industrial infrastructure 6 in areas of this state adjacent to the Gulf of Mexico that are most 7 vulnerable to damage from hurricanes and flooding; (5) one member representing the tourist and 8 hospitality industry in areas of this state adjacent to the Gulf of 9 10 Mexico that are most vulnerable to damage from hurricanes and 11 flooding; and 12 (6) one member representing small businesses in this state that would be affected following a disaster by loss of 13 customers, lost employees, and limited insurance. 14 15 (d) Members of the advisory council serve staggered four-year terms. 16 17 (e) An advisory council member is not entitled to compensation but is entitled to reimbursement for travel expenses 18 19 incurred by the member while conducting the business of the advisory council. 20 21 (f) The advisory council members shall elect a presiding 22 officer from among the members. 23 (g) The advisory council shall: 24 (1) provide advice on disaster recovery mitigation and resilience, specifically related to housing; 25 26 (2) provide information on advanced technological systems for disaster construction engineering and other innovative 27

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1 solutions for addressing infrastructure risks; 2 (3) provide information on banking and insurance requirements imposed following a disaster that may affect housing 3 construction and recovery in areas affected by the disaster; 4 5 (4) provide advice during disaster recovery on issues faced by state and local governments; and 6 7 (5) propose solutions to address inefficiencies or 8 problems in the state or local governmental disaster response with respect to issues described by this subsection. 9 The advisory council shall meet at the times and 10 (h) locations determined by the presiding officer, not to exceed four 11 12 meetings each year. (i) Not later than November 1 of each even-numbered year, 13 the advisory council shall submit a report on the advisory 14 15 council's activities, advice, and proposed solutions to the commissioner, the Texas Division of Emergency Management, the 16 17 governor, the lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of 18 representatives. 19 (j) The land office shall provide administrative support to the advisory council. 20 21 (k) Chapter 2110, Government Code, does not apply to the 22 advisory council. SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date 23 24 of this Act, the commissioner of the General Land Office shall appoint to the business advisory council on disaster recovery and 25 26 mitigation two members to terms expiring February 1, 2021, two members to terms expiring February 1, 2022, and two members to 27

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1 terms expiring February 1, 2023.

2 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
