A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the Lower Colorado River Authority, following
3	recommendations of the Sunset Advisory Commission.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 8503, Special District Local Laws Code,
6	is amended by adding Sections 8503.0065, 8503.0105, 8503.0106,
7	8503.0107, and 8503.0108 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 8503.0065. DIRECTOR TRAINING. (a) A person who is
9	appointed to and qualifies for office as a director may not vote,
10	deliberate, or be counted as a director in attendance at a board
11	meeting until the person completes a training program that complies
12	with this section.
13	(b) The training program must provide the person with
14	information regarding:
15	(1) the law governing authority operations;
16	(2) the programs, functions, rules, and budget of the
17	authority;
18	(3) the scope of and limitations on the rulemaking
19	authority of the authority;
20	(4) the results of the most recent formal audit of the
21	authority;
22	(5) the requirements of:
23	(A) laws relating to open meetings, public

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information, administrative procedure, and disclosure of conflicts

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   of interest; and
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                    (B) other laws applicable to members of the
   governing body of a river authority in performing their duties; and
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               (6) any applicable ethics policies adopted by the
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   authority or the Texas Ethics Commission.
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         (c) A person appointed to the board is entitled to
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   reimbursement for the travel expenses incurred in attending the
   training program regardless of whether the attendance at the
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   program occurs before or after the person qualifies for office.
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         (d) The general manager of the authority shall create a
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   training manual that includes the information required by
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   Subsection (b) of this section. The general manager shall
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   distribute a copy of the training manual annually to each director.
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   Each director shall sign and submit to the general manager a
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   statement acknowledging that the director has received the training
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   manual.
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         Sec. 8503.0105. PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT POLICY. The board shall
   develop and implement a policy that provides a structure for public
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   engagement in regard to water supply projects. The policy must
   include a clear and detailed description of how the authority will
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   seek to actively engage stakeholders, including the possible use
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   of:
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              (1) advisory committees;
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               (2) community panels;
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               (3) town hall meetings; and
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               (4) other strategies on a recurring basis.
         Sec. 8503.0106. COMPLAINTS. (a) The authority shall
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- 1 maintain a system to promptly and efficiently act on complaints
- 2 filed with the authority. The authority shall maintain information
- 3 about parties to the complaint, the subject matter of the
- 4 complaint, a summary of the results of the review or investigation
- 5 of the complaint, and its disposition.
- 6 (b) The authority shall make information available to the
- 7 public, including on the authority's website, describing its
- 8 procedures for complaint investigation and resolution.
- 9 (c) The authority shall periodically notify the complaint
- 10 parties of the status of the complaint until final disposition.
- 11 (d) The authority shall develop a standard form and a
- 12 procedure for submitting complaints to the authority and shall make
- 13 that form and procedure available on the authority's website. The
- 14 <u>authority shall also make available on its website clear</u>
- 15 <u>information about what a person making a complaint should expect</u>
- 16 after the complaint is filed, including timelines for response and
- 17 resolution.
- Sec. 8503.0107. PUBLIC TESTIMONY. (a) In this section,
- 19 "committee-of-the-whole" means a committee of the board in which
- 20 every director is a member of the committee.
- 21 (b) The board shall develop and implement policies that
- 22 provide the public with a reasonable opportunity to appear before
- 23 the board and to speak on any issue under the jurisdiction of the
- 24 authority.
- 25 (c) At each regular meeting of the board and each meeting as
- 26 a committee-of-the-whole, the board shall include public testimony
- 27 as a meeting agenda item and allow members of the public to comment

- 1 on every agenda item and other matters under the jurisdiction of the
- 2 authority. The board may not deliberate or decide a matter not
- 3 included in the meeting agenda except to discuss including the
- 4 matter on the agenda for a subsequent meeting.
- 5 Sec. 8503.0108. ALTERNATIVE RULEMAKING AND DISPUTE
- 6 RESOLUTION PROCEDURES. (a) The board shall develop a policy to
- 7 encourage the use of:
- 8 <u>(1) negotiated rulemaking procedures under Chapter</u>
- 9 2008, Government Code, for the adoption of authority rules; and
- 10 (2) appropriate alternative dispute resolution
- 11 procedures under Chapter 2009, Government Code, to assist in the
- 12 resolution of internal and external disputes under the authority's
- 13 jurisdiction.
- 14 (b) The authority's procedures relating to alternative
- 15 dispute resolution must conform, to the extent possible, to any
- 16 model guidelines issued by the State Office of Administrative
- 17 Hearings for the use of alternative dispute resolution by state
- 18 agencies.
- 19 (c) The authority shall:
- 20 (1) coordinate the implementation of the policy
- 21 adopted under Subsection (a) of this section;
- 22 (2) provide training as needed to implement the
- 23 procedures for negotiated rulemaking or alternative dispute
- 24 resolution; and
- 25 (3) collect data concerning the effectiveness of those
- 26 procedures.
- 27 SECTION 2. Notwithstanding Section 8503.0065, Special

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- 1 District Local Laws Code, as added by this Act, a person serving on
- 2 the board of directors of the Lower Colorado River Authority may
- 3 vote, deliberate, and be counted as a director in attendance at a
- 4 meeting of the board until December 1, 2019.
- 5 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
