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this section, Section 651.0511, Occupations Code, as amended by

- 2 Commission appointed before, on, or after the effective date of
- 3 this Act.
- 4 (b) A member of the Texas Funeral Service Commission who,
- 5 before the effective date of this Act, completed the training
- 6 program required by Section 651.0511, Occupations Code, as that law
- 7 existed before the effective date of this Act, is required to
- 8 complete additional training only on subjects added by this Act to
- 9 the training program as required by Section 651.0511, Occupations
- 10 Code, as amended by this Act. A member of the commission described
- 11 by this subsection may not vote, deliberate, or be counted as a
- 12 member in attendance at a meeting of the commission held on or after
