A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the availability of certain school district or
3	open-enrollment charter school financial information on certain
4	districts' or schools' Internet websites.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Chapter 44, Education Code, is amended by adding
7	Subchapter D to read as follows:
8	SUBCHAPTER D. FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE
9	Sec. 44.101. APPLICABILITY. This subchapter applies only
10	<u>to:</u>
11	(1) a school district that is ranked among the 50
12	highest in student enrollment, as determined by the commissioner;
13	<u>and</u>
14	(2) an open-enrollment charter school that is ranked
15	among the 10 highest in student enrollment, as determined by the
16	commissioner based on the aggregated student enrollment of all
17	<pre>campuses under the school's charter.</pre>
18	Sec. 44.102. FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE. (a) A school district
19	or open-enrollment charter school shall maintain on the district's
20	or school's Internet website an electronic database of district or
21	school finances. The database must include, if applicable:
22	(1) for the immediately preceding fiscal year:
23	(A) total expenditures as a dollar amount and a
24	dollar amount per student in average daily attendance;

1	(B) total revenue as a dollar amount and a dollar
2	amount per student in average daily attendance;
3	(C) total revenue from property taxes as a dollar
4	amount and a dollar amount per student in average daily attendance;
5	(D) the total number of full-time equivalent
6	positions for the district or school; and
7	(E) for a district subject to Chapter 41, any
8	amount expended by the district to purchase attendance credits in
9	an amount sufficient for the district to reduce the district's
10	wealth per student to the equalized wealth level;
11	(2) a graphical representation of the district's or
12	school's operating and debt service funds, including:
13	(A) the total budgeted allocation and per student
14	in average daily attendance allocation for the current school year,
15	separated by each applicable assigned:
16	(i) function code; and
17	(ii) object code determined by the
18	commissioner as a major object code; and
19	(B) the actual revenues and expenditures for each
20	of the four preceding fiscal years, separated by each applicable
21	assigned:
22	(i) function code; and
23	(ii) object code determined by the
24	commissioner as a major object code;
25	(3) the district's or school's annual financial report
26	for the preceding five fiscal years;
27	(4) in a searchable electronic format:

1	(A) the transaction register for each district or
2	school checking account, including for each check written from a
3	district or school checking account:
4	(i) the transaction amount;
5	(ii) the name of the payee;
6	(iii) the date the check was issued; and
7	(iv) a statement of the purpose of the
8	expenditure for which the check was written; and
9	(B) a governing board financial report, updated
10	at least quarterly, comparing revenues and expenditures with:
11	(i) the adopted and amended budget; and
12	(ii) revenues and expenditures from the
13	<pre>preceding fiscal year;</pre>
14	(5) a visualization chart depicting district or school
15	financial data trends for the preceding five fiscal years that
16	shows for each fiscal year:
17	(A) total expenditures per student in average
18	<pre>daily attendance;</pre>
19	(B) total revenue per student in average daily
20	attendance; and
21	(C) for a district, the district property tax
22	rate expressed in dollars per \$100 valuation;
23	(6) contact information for the district or school and
24	members of the governing body of the district or school; and
25	(7) a link to a web page maintained by the district or
26	school that provides instructions for submitting a request for
27	information under Chapter 552, Government Code.

- 1 (b) The school district's or open-enrollment charter
- 2 school's annual financial report for the current fiscal year must
- 3 be posted not later than the first anniversary of the end of the
- 4 fiscal year.
- 5 (c) A school district or open-enrollment charter school
- 6 shall:
- 7 (1) update the electronic checking account
- 8 transaction register at least once each month, not later than the
- 9 30th day after the closing date of the most recent monthly statement
- 10 for the checking account;
- 11 (2) maintain each transaction or listing in the
- 12 <u>electronic checking account transaction register on the district's</u>
- 13 or school's Internet website until at least the third anniversary
- 14 of the date of the transaction or listing; and
- 15 (3) for each fiscal year that transactions and
- 16 listings are included in the electronic checking account
- 17 transaction register, group together the transactions and listings
- 18 by fiscal year.
- 19 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2020.
