S.B. No. 629

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the availability of certain school district financial 3 information on certain districts' Internet websites. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 44, Education Code, is amended by adding Subchapter D to read as follows: 6 SUBCHAPTER D. FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE 7 Sec. 44.101. APPLICABILITY. This subchapter applies only 8 9 to a school district that is ranked among the 50 highest in student enrollment, as determined by the commissioner. 10 Sec. 44.102. FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE. (a) A school district 11 12 shall maintain on the district's Internet website an electronic database of district finances. The database must include: 13 14 (1) for the immediately preceding fiscal year: (A) total expenditures as a dollar amount and a 15 16 dollar amount per student in average daily attendance; (B) total revenue as a dollar amount and a dollar 17 amount per student in average daily attendance; 18 19 (C) total revenue from property taxes as a dollar amount and a dollar amount per student in average daily attendance; 20 21 and 22 (D) the total number of full-time equivalent 23 positions for the district; 24 (2) a graphical representation of the district's

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1	operating and debt service funds, including:
2	(A) the total budgeted allocation and per student
3	in average daily attendance allocation for the current school year,
4	separated by each applicable assigned:
5	(i) function code; and
6	(ii) object code determined by the
7	commissioner as a major object code; and
8	(B) the actual revenues and expenditures for each
9	of the four preceding fiscal years, separated by each applicable
10	assigned:
11	(i) function code; and
12	(ii) object code determined by the
13	commissioner as a major object code;
14	(3) the district's annual financial report for the
15	preceding five fiscal years;
16	(4) in a searchable electronic format:
17	(A) the transaction register for each district
18	checking account, including for each check written from a district
19	checking account:
20	(i) the transaction amount;
21	(ii) the name of the payee;
22	(iii) the date the check was issued; and
23	(iv) a statement of the purpose of the
24	expenditure for which the check was written; and
25	(B) a board financial report, updated at least
26	quarterly, comparing revenues and expenditures with:
27	(i) the adopted and amended budget; and

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1	(ii) revenues and expenditures from the
2	preceding fiscal year;
3	(5) a visualization chart depicting district
4	financial data trends for the preceding five fiscal years that
5	shows for each fiscal year:
6	(A) total expenditures per student in average
7	daily attendance;
8	(B) total revenue per student in average daily
9	attendance; and
10	(C) the district property tax rate expressed in
11	dollars per \$100 valuation;
12	(6) contact information for the district and members
13	of the board of trustees of the district; and
14	(7) a link to a web page maintained by the district
15	that provides instructions for submitting a request for information
16	under Chapter 552, Government Code.
17	(b) The district's annual financial report for the current
18	fiscal year must be posted not later than the first anniversary of
19	the end of the fiscal year.
20	(c) A school district shall:
21	(1) update the electronic checking account
22	transaction register at least once each month, not later than the
23	30th day after the closing date of the most recent monthly statement
24	for the checking account;
25	(2) maintain each transaction or listing in the
26	electronic checking account transaction register on the district's
27	Internet website until at least the third anniversary of the date of

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1	the transaction or listing; and
2	(3) for each fiscal year that transactions and
3	listings are included in the electronic checking account
4	transaction register, group together the transactions and listings
5	by fiscal year.
6	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2020.
