A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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| 2 | relating to the creation of the University of Houston College of |
| 3 | Medicine at the University of Houston. |
| 4 | BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: |
| 5 | SECTION 1. Chapter 111, Education Code, is amended by |
| 6 | adding Subchapter K to read as follows: |
| 7 | SUBCHAPTER K. UNIVERSITY OF HOUSTON COLLEGE OF MEDICINE |
| 8 | Sec. 111.151. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter: |
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- 9 <u>(1) "Board" means the board of regents of the</u> 10 University of Houston System.
- 11 (2) "College" means the University of Houston College

 12 of Medicine established under this subchapter.
- Sec. 111.152. THE UNIVERSITY OF HOUSTON COLLEGE OF

 MEDICINE. The University of Houston College of Medicine is a

 college of the University of Houston and is under the management and

 control of the board with degrees offered under the name and
- 17 authority of the University of Houston.
- Sec. 111.153. COURSES AND DEGREES. The board may prescribe

 courses leading to customary degrees and may adopt rules for the

 operation, control, and management of the college as necessary for
- 21 conducting a college of medicine of the first class.
- Sec. 111.154. AFFILIATION AGREEMENTS. The dean of the college, on behalf of the board, may execute and carry out an

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affiliation or coordinating agreement with any other entity or

- 1 <u>institution in the college's region.</u>
- 2 Sec. 111.155. GIFTS AND GRANTS. The board may solicit,
- 3 accept, and administer gifts and grants from any public or private
- 4 source for the use and benefit of the college.
- 5 Sec. 111.156. OTHER FACILITIES. In addition to the
- 6 college's facilities, the board may enter into agreements under
- 7 which additional facilities used in the college's teaching and
- 8 research programs, including libraries, auditoriums, research
- 9 facilities, and medical education buildings, may be provided by a
- 10 public or private entity.
- Sec. 111.157. TEACHING HOSPITAL. A teaching hospital
- 12 considered suitable by the board may be provided by a public or
- 13 private entity. The hospital may not be constructed, maintained, or
- 14 operated with state funds.
- Sec. 111.158. ACCOUNTABILITY INFORMATION. Not later than
- 16 October 1 of each year, the college shall post on the college's
- 17 Internet website the following information regarding students
- 18 enrolled at the college:
- 19 (1) the percentage of students from groups that are
- 20 underrepresented in the practice of medicine, such as students from
- 21 racial or ethnic minority groups or students from an economically
- 22 <u>disadvantaged background;</u>
- 23 (2) the percentage of students who enroll in
- 24 coursework indicating a student focus in primary care or mental
- 25 health care; and
- 26 (3) whether the college has implemented a mandatory
- 27 clerkship or internship that requires each student to spend:

- 1 (A) not less than 60 days in a medically
- 2 underserved area during the student's enrollment, with priority
- 3 given to areas within a 10-mile radius of the college; and
- 4 (B) not less than an average of four hours each
- 5 week over a four-year period during the student's enrollment
- 6 serving in a primary health care clinic, such as a federally
- 7 qualified health center as defined by 42 U.S.C. Section
- 8 1396d(1)(2)(B), in Harris County or a county that is adjacent to
- 9 Harris County.
- SECTION 2. Sections 59.01(1) and (3), Education Code, are
- 11 amended to read as follows:
- 12 (1) "Medical staff or students" means medical doctors,
- 13 doctors of osteopathy, dentists, veterinarians, and podiatrists
- 14 appointed to the faculty or professional medical staff employed for
- 15 student health services by The University of Texas System, The
- 16 Texas A&M University System, the Texas Tech University System, the
- 17 University of Houston College of Medicine, or the University of
- 18 North Texas Health Science Center at Fort Worth, either full time or
- 19 who, although appointed less than full time (including volunteers),
- 20 either devote their total professional service to such appointment
- 21 or provide services to patients by assignment from the department
- 22 chairman; and interns, residents, fellows, and medical or dental
- 23 students, veterinary students, and students of osteopathy
- 24 participating in a patient-care program in The University of Texas
- 25 System, The Texas A&M University System, the Texas Tech University
- 26 System, the University of Houston College of Medicine, or the
- 27 University of North Texas Health Science Center at Fort Worth.

- 1 (3) "Board" means the board of regents of The
- 2 University of Texas System, the board of regents of The Texas A&M
- 3 University System, the board of regents of the Texas Tech
- 4 University System, the board of regents of the University of
- 5 Houston System, or the board of regents of the University of North
- 6 Texas.
- 7 SECTION 3. Sections 59.02(a) and (c), Education Code, are
- 8 amended to read as follows:
- 9 (a) Each board may establish a separate self-insurance fund
- 10 to pay any damages adjudged in a court of competent jurisdiction or
- 11 a settlement of any medical malpractice claim against a member of
- 12 the medical staff or students arising from the exercise of the
- 13 member's [his] appointment, duties, or training with The University
- 14 of Texas System, The Texas A&M University System, the Texas Tech
- 15 University System, the University of Houston College of Medicine,
- 16 or the University of North Texas Health Science Center at Fort
- 17 Worth.
- 18 (c) On the establishment of each fund, transfers to the fund
- 19 shall be made in an amount and at such intervals as determined by
- 20 the board. Each board may receive and accept any gifts or
- 21 donations specified for the purposes of this subchapter and deposit
- 22 those gifts or donations into the fund. Each board may invest
- 23 money deposited in the fund, and any income received shall be
- 24 retained in the fund. The money shall be deposited in any of the
- 25 approved depository banks of The University of Texas System, The
- 26 Texas A&M University System, the Texas Tech University System, the
- 27 University of Houston System, or the University of North Texas

- 1 Health Science Center at Fort Worth. All expenditures from the
- 2 funds shall be paid pursuant to approval by the boards.
- 3 SECTION 4. Section 59.06, Education Code, is amended to
- 4 read as follows:
- 5 Sec. 59.06. LIMITATION ON APPROPRIATED FUNDS. Funds
- 6 appropriated by the legislature to either system, to the Texas Tech
- 7 University Health Sciences Center, to the Texas Tech University
- 8 Health Sciences Center at El Paso, to the University of Houston for
- 9 the University of Houston College of Medicine, or to the University
- 10 of North Texas Health Science Center at Fort Worth from the General
- 11 Revenue Fund may not be used to establish or maintain the fund, to
- 12 purchase insurance, or to employ private legal counsel.
- SECTION 5. Section 61.003(5), Education Code, is amended to
- 14 read as follows:
- 15 (5) "Medical and dental unit" means The Texas A&M
- 16 University System Health Science Center and its component
- 17 institutions, agencies, and programs; the Texas Tech University
- 18 Health Sciences Center; the Texas Tech University Health Sciences
- 19 Center at El Paso; the University of Houston College of Medicine;
- 20 The University of Texas Medical Branch at Galveston; The University
- 21 of Texas Southwestern Medical Center; The University of Texas
- 22 Medical School at San Antonio; The University of Texas Dental
- 23 Branch at Houston; The University of Texas M. D. Anderson Cancer
- 24 Center; The University of Texas Graduate School of Biomedical
- 25 Sciences at Houston; The University of Texas Dental School at San
- 26 Antonio; The University of Texas Medical School at Houston; The
- 27 University of Texas Health Science Center--South Texas and its

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- 1 component institutions, if established under Subchapter N, Chapter
- 2 74; the nursing institutions of The Texas A&M University System and
- 3 The University of Texas System; and The University of Texas School
- 4 of Public Health at Houston; and such other medical or dental
- 5 schools as may be established by statute or as provided in this
- 6 chapter.
- 7 SECTION 6. Section 61.501(1), Education Code, is amended to
- 8 read as follows:
- 9 (1) "Medical school" means the medical school at The
- 10 University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston, the medical
- 11 school at The University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center, the
- 12 medical school at The University of Texas Health Science Center at
- 13 San Antonio, The University of Texas Medical Branch at Galveston,
- 14 the medical school at The University of Texas at Austin, the medical
- 15 school at The University of Texas Rio Grande Valley, the medical
- 16 education program of The University of Texas Health Science Center
- 17 at Tyler, the medical school at the Texas Tech University Health
- 18 Sciences Center, the medical school at the Texas Tech University
- 19 Health Sciences Center at El Paso, the University of Houston
- 20 <u>College of Medicine</u>, the Baylor College of Medicine, the college of
- 21 osteopathic medicine at the University of North Texas Health
- 22 Science Center at Fort Worth, or the medical school at the Texas A&M
- 23 University Health Science Center.
- SECTION 7. Section 63.002(c), Education Code, is amended to
- 25 read as follows:
- 26 (c) The amount available for distribution from the fund may
- 27 be appropriated only for programs that benefit medical research,

- 1 health education, or treatment programs at the following
- 2 health-related institutions of higher education:
- 3 (1) The University of Texas Health Science Center at
- 4 San Antonio;
- 5 (2) The University of Texas M. D. Anderson Cancer
- 6 Center;
- 7 (3) The University of Texas Southwestern Medical
- 8 Center;
- 9 (4) The University of Texas Medical Branch at
- 10 Galveston;
- 11 (5) The University of Texas Health Science Center at
- 12 Houston;
- 13 (6) The University of Texas Health Science Center at
- 14 Tyler;
- 15 (7) The University of Texas Health Science
- 16 Center--South Texas and its component institutions, if established
- 17 under Subchapter N, Chapter 74;
- 18 (8) The Texas A&M University Health Science Center;
- 19 (9) the University of North Texas Health Science
- 20 Center at Fort Worth;
- 21 (10) the Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center;
- 22 (11) the Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center
- 23 at El Paso; [and]
- 24 (12) the University of Houston College of Medicine;
- 25 and
- 26 (13) Baylor College of Medicine, if a contract between
- 27 Baylor College of Medicine and the Texas Higher Education

- 1 Coordinating Board is in effect under Section 61.092.
- 2 SECTION 8. Not later than October 1, 2020, the University of
- 3 Houston College of Medicine shall post on the college's Internet
- 4 website the initial information required under Section 111.158,
- 5 Education Code, as added by this Act.
- 6 SECTION 9. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
