- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 521.271(a), Transportation Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) Each original driver's license, provisional license,
- 8 learner license, or occupational driver's license issued to an
- 9 applicant who is a citizen, national, or legal permanent resident
- 10 of the United States or a refugee or asylee lawfully admitted into
- 11 the United States expires as follows:
- 12 (1) except as provided by Section 521.2711, a driver's
- 13 license expires on the <u>eighth</u> [<u>first birthday of the license holder</u>
- 14 occurring after the sixth] anniversary of the date of the
- 15 application;
- 16 (2) a provisional license expires on the 18th birthday
- 17 of the license holder;
- 18 (3) a learner license expires on the 18th birthday of
- 19 the license holder;
- 20 (4) an occupational driver's license expires on the
- 21 first anniversary of the court order granting the license; and
- 22 (5) unless an earlier date is otherwise provided, a
- 23 driver's license issued to a person whose residence or domicile is a
- 24 correctional facility or a parole facility expires on the first

- 1 birthday of the license holder occurring after the first
- 2 anniversary of the date of issuance.
- 3 SECTION 2. Section 521.421(a), Transportation Code, is
- 4 amended to read as follows:
- 5 (a) The fee for issuance or renewal of a license not
- 6 otherwise provided for by this section is $\frac{$32}{$}$ [\$24].
- 7 SECTION 3. The changes in law made by this Act to Sections
- 8 521.271 and 521.421, Transportation Code, apply only to a driver's
- 9 license issued or renewed on or after June 1, 2020. A driver's
- 10 license issued or renewed before June 1, 2020, is governed by the
- 11 law in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and
- 12 the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
