16	SECTION 2. Section 1952.051, Occupations Code, is amended
17	by adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:
18	(c) The education requirements adopted under Subsection (b)
19	must include education regarding the principles and procedures for
20	a code enforcement officer to follow when possessing or carrying an
21	instrument used specifically for deterring an animal bite.
22	SECTION 3. Section 1952.1051, Occupations Code, is amended
23	to read as follows:
24	Sec. 1952.1051. CONTINUING EDUCATION. The commission by

- 1 rule shall prescribe continuing education requirements for code
- 2 enforcement officers and code enforcement officers in training
- 3 that:
- 4 (1) establish the number of hours of continuing
- 5 education required for renewal of a certificate of registration;
- 6 (2) establish an approved curriculum that includes
- 7 material regarding changes in applicable law <u>and the principles and</u>
- 8 procedures to follow when possessing or carrying an instrument used
- 9 specifically for deterring an animal bite; and
- 10 (3) provide that the approved curriculum may be taught
- 11 by suitable public agencies and by private entities approved by the
