- 2 relating to personal financial literacy courses for high school

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 28.0021, Education Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (c) to read as
- 7 follows:
- 8 (b) Each school district and each open-enrollment charter
- 9 school that offers a high school program shall provide a [an
- 10 elective] course in personal financial literacy that meets the
- 11 requirements for [a one-half elective] credit under Section 28.025,
- 12 using materials approved by the State Board of Education. The
- 13 course may be offered as a distinct course in personal financial
- 14 literacy or as an elective course or existing course that includes
- 15 instruction in personal financial literacy sufficient to meet the
- 16 requirements for one-half credit under Section 28.025(b-1)(4). The
- 17 instruction in personal financial literacy must include
- 18 instruction on:
- 19 (1) completing the application for federal student aid
- 20 provided by the United States Department of Education;
- 21 (2) the financial consequences of failing to make
- 22 timely student loan payments;
- 23 (3) the effect of student loan debt on a person's
- 24 finances; and

- 1 (4) the circumstances in which student loans are
- 2 dischargeable in bankruptcy.
- 3 (c) In fulfilling the requirement to provide financial
- 4 literacy instruction under this section, a school district or
- 5 open-enrollment charter school may use an existing state, federal,
- 6 private, or nonprofit program that provides students without charge
- 7 the instruction described under this section.
- 8 SECTION 2. Section 28.025(b-1), Education Code, is amended
- 9 to read as follows:
- 10 (b-1) The State Board of Education by rule shall require
- 11 that the curriculum requirements for the foundation high school
- 12 program under Subsection (a) include a requirement that students
- 13 successfully complete:
- 14 (1) four credits in English language arts under
- 15 Section 28.002(a)(1)(A), including one credit in English I, one
- 16 credit in English II, one credit in English III, and one credit in
- 17 an advanced English course authorized under Subsection (b-2);
- 18 (2) three credits in mathematics under Section
- 19 28.002(a)(1)(B), including one credit in Algebra I, one credit in
- 20 geometry, and one credit in any advanced mathematics course
- 21 authorized under Subsection (b-2);
- 22 (3) three credits in science under Section
- 28.002(a)(1)(C), including one credit in biology, one credit in any
- 24 advanced science course authorized under Subsection (b-2), and one
- 25 credit in integrated physics and chemistry or in an additional
- 26 advanced science course authorized under Subsection (b-2);
- 27 (4) three credits in social studies under Section

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- 1 28.002(a)(1)(D), including one credit in United States history, at
- 2 least one-half credit in government and at least one-half credit in
- 3 economics or personal financial literacy, and one credit in world
- 4 geography or world history;
- 5 (5) except as provided under Subsections (b-12)
- 6 (b-13), and (b-14), two credits in the same language in a language
- 7 other than English under Section 28.002(a)(2)(A);
- 8 (6) five elective credits;
- 9 (7) one credit in fine arts under Section
- 10 28.002(a)(2)(D); and
- 11 (8) except as provided by Subsection (b-11), one
- 12 credit in physical education under Section 28.002(a)(2)(C).
- 13 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 14 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 15 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 16 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 17 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
