2	relating to the administration of the Jobs and Education for Texans
3	(JET) Grant Program.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 134.001, Education Code, is amended by
6	adding Subdivision (1-a) to read as follows:
7	<u>(1-a) "Nonprofit organization" means an organization</u>
8	exempt from federal income taxation under Section 501(a), Internal
9	Revenue Code of 1986, as an organization described by Section
10	501(c)(3) of that code.
11	SECTION 2. Section 134.003, Education Code, is amended by
12	amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (b-1) to read as
13	follows:
14	(b) The advisory board is composed of <u>eight</u> [six] members
15	who serve two-year terms and are appointed as follows:
16	(1) one member appointed by the governor;
17	(2) one member appointed by the lieutenant governor;
18	(3) one member appointed by the speaker of the house of
19	representatives;
20	(4) one member appointed by the Texas Higher Education
21	Coordinating Board;
22	(5) one member appointed by the commissioner of
23	education;
24	(6) two members [one member] appointed by the

commission, one of whom must represent a nonprofit organization 1 2 located in this state that provides, or has experience in 3 providing, training services that prepare low-income students for 4 careers in high-demand occupations; and 5 (7) [(6)] the chair of the commission, who serves as the presiding officer. 6 7 (b-1) Before appointing the members described by Subsection (b)(6), the commission shall publish a request for applications and 8 must consider appointing qualified individuals from among the 9 resulting applicant pool. 10 SECTION 3. Section 134.004, Education Code, is amended to 11 read as follows: 12 Sec. 134.004. JOBS AND EDUCATION FOR TEXANS (JET) GRANT 13 (a) The commission shall establish and administer the 14 PROGRAM. Jobs and Education for Texans (JET) Grant Program to provide grants 15 16 to public junior colleges, public technical institutes, public state colleges, eligible nonprofit organizations, and independent 17 school districts described under Section 134.007 that apply to the 18 advisory board in the manner prescribed by the advisory board. The 19 20 commission shall award the grants on the advice and recommendations of the advisory board. 21 22 Grants may be awarded under this chapter from the Jobs (b) and Education for Texans (JET) fund for the following purposes:

(1) to develop, support, or expand programs of 24 25 nonprofit organizations that meet the requirements of Section 134.005 and that prepare low-income students for careers in 26 27 high-demand occupations; and

1 (2) to defray the start-up costs associated with the 2 development of new career and technical education programs at 3 public junior colleges, public technical institutes, public state 4 colleges, and independent school districts described under Section 5 134.007 that meet the requirements of Section 134.006.

6 SECTION 4. Chapter 134, Education Code, is amended by 7 adding Section 134.005 to read as follows:

8 <u>Sec. 134.005. GRANTS TO NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS FOR</u> 9 <u>INNOVATIVE AND SUCCESSFUL PROGRAMS. (a) The commission may award</u> 10 <u>a grant to a nonprofit organization eligible under Subsection (b)</u> 11 <u>for the development, support, or expansion of programs to prepare</u> 12 <u>low-income students for careers in high-demand occupations.</u>

13 (b) To be eligible to receive a grant under this section, a
14 nonprofit organization must:

15 (1) provide a program to offer assistance to 16 low-income students in preparing for, applying to, and enrolling in 17 a public junior college or public technical institute;

18 (2) be governed by a board or other governing 19 structure that includes recognized leaders of broad-based 20 community organizations and members of the local business 21 community;

22 (3) demonstrate to the satisfaction of the advisory 23 board that the organization's program has achieved or will achieve 24 the following measures of success among program participants to the 25 extent applicable to the type of program the organization provides: 26 (A) above-average completion of developmental 27 education among participating public junior college or public

1	technical institute students;
2	(B) above-average persistence rates among
3	participating public junior college or public technical institute
4	students;
5	(C) above-average certificate or degree
6	completion rates by participating students within a three-year
7	period compared to demographically comparable public junior
8	college and public technical institute students; and
9	(D) employment of participating students at an
10	average full-time starting wage that is equal to or greater than
11	the prevailing wage for the occupation entered; and
12	(4) provide matching funds in accordance with rules
13	adopted under Section 134.008.
14	(c) The matching funds required under Subsection (b)(4) may
15	be obtained from any source available to the nonprofit
16	organization, including in-kind contributions, community or
17	foundation grants, individual contributions, and local
18	governmental agency operating funds.
19	(d) Grants awarded under this section must be awarded in a
20	manner that takes a balanced geographical distribution into
21	consideration.
22	SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
