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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to state agency electronic information and processes.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 2054.0286, Government Code, is amended
5	to read as follows:
6	Sec. 2054.0286. <u>CHIEF DATA OFFICER</u> [STATEWIDE DATA
7	COORDINATOR]. (a) The executive director, using existing
8	department funds, shall employ a <u>chief data officer</u> [statewide data
9	coordinator] to:
10	(1) improve the control and security of information
11	collected by state agencies;
12	(2) promote between state agencies the sharing of
13	information, including customer information; [and]
14	(3) reduce information collection costs incurred by
15	this state; and
16	(4) assist the department in the development and
17	management of a data portal for use by state agencies.
18	(b) The <u>chief data officer</u> [statewide data coordinator]
19	shall develop and implement best practices among state agencies to:
20	(1) improve interagency information coordination;
21	(2) reduce duplicative information collection;
22	(3) increase accountability and ensure compliance
23	with statutes and rules requiring agencies to share information;
24	(4) improve information management and analysis to

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1 increase information security, uncover fraud and waste, reduce 2 agency costs, improve agency operations, and verify compliance with 3 applicable laws;

(5) encourage agencies to collect and post on the
agencies' Internet websites or the data portal managed by the
department information related to an agency's [agency] functions or
other data maintained by the agency that is in an open file format
and is machine-readable, exportable, and easily accessible by the
public; and

10 (6) encourage the evaluation of open document formats11 for storing data and documents generated by state agencies.

12 (c) Each state agency shall cooperate with the <u>chief data</u> 13 <u>officer</u> [statewide data coordinator] in fulfilling the 14 requirements of this section.

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[(d) This section expires September 1, 2021.]

16 SECTION 2. Subchapter C, Chapter 2054, Government Code, is 17 amended by adding Sections 2054.069 and 2054.070 to read as 18 follows:

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 Sec. 2054.069. DIGITAL TRANSFORMATION GUIDE. (a) The

 department shall establish a digital transformation guide to assist

 state agencies with:

22 (1) modernizing agency operations and services with 23 respect to electronic data; and

24 (2) converting agency information into electronic

26 (b) The department may provide:
27 (1) mobile application development assistance;

1	(2) paper document and form inventory assistance;
2	(3) paperless or paper-on-request operational process
3	planning and development; and
4	(4) electronic notification and digital communication
5	between the agency and the public.
6	Sec. 2054.070. CENTRAL REPOSITORY FOR PUBLICLY ACCESSIBLE
7	ELECTRONIC DATA. (a) The department shall:
8	(1) establish a central repository of publicly
9	accessible electronic data as the official open data Internet
10	website for this state;
11	(2) designate the repository as the Texas Open Data
12	Portal; and
13	(3) ensure that state agencies and political
14	subdivisions of this state are granted shared access to the
15	repository that allows the agencies and political subdivisions to
16	easily post publicly accessible information to the repository.
17	(b) Each state agency shall prioritize using the central
18	repository of electronic data established under Subsection (a) and
19	actively collaborate with the department on publicly accessible
20	data issues.
21	SECTION 3. Section 2054.071, Government Code, is amended to
22	read as follows:
23	Sec. 2054.071. IDENTITY OF MANAGER; CONSOLIDATION.
24	(a) Each state agency shall designate an employee of the agency to
25	[The presiding officer of the governing body of a state agency, if
26	the agency is governed by one or more fully paid full-time state
27	officials, and otherwise the executive director of the agency, or

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1 the designated representative of the presiding officer or executive
2 director, shall] serve as the agency's information resources
3 manager.

4 (b) <u>An employee</u> [A representative] designated under
5 Subsection (a) may be designated to serve as a joint information
6 resources manager by two or more state agencies. The department
7 must approve the joint designation.

8 SECTION 4. Section 2157.007(b), Government Code, is amended 9 to read as follows:

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(b) A state agency shall consider:

11 (1) cloud computing service options, including any 12 security benefits and cost savings associated with purchasing those 13 service options from a cloud computing service provider and from a 14 statewide technology center established by the department, when 15 making purchases for a major information resources project under 16 Section 2054.118; and

17 (2) cloud computing service options and compatibility 18 with cloud computing services in the development of new information 19 technology software applications.

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SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.

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
