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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the name of the Southwest Collegiate Institute for the 3 Deaf.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Chapter 131, Education Code, is amended to read 6 as follows:

7 CHAPTER 131. SOUTHWEST <u>COLLEGE</u> [COLLEGIATE INSTITUTE] FOR THE DEAF 8 Sec. 131.001. SOUTHWEST <u>COLLEGE</u> [COLLEGIATE INSTITUTE] FOR 9 THE DEAF. The Southwest <u>College</u> [Collegiate Institute] for the 10 Deaf is a postsecondary educational institution providing 11 instruction for hearing-impaired students preparing for a career or 12 for enrollment in a senior college or university.

Sec. 131.002. ADMINISTRATION. (a) The <u>college</u> [institute] is under the direct control and management of the board of trustees of the Howard Junior College District.

16 (b) The <u>college</u> [institute] and its programs shall be 17 administered by personnel who are trained and qualified to work 18 with hearing-impaired students and are fluent in manual 19 communication skills.

Sec. 131.003. LOCATION. The <u>college</u> [institute] is located on land deeded to the governing board by the federal Department of Education for the purpose of operating the <u>college</u> [institute]. The governing board may not conduct regular junior college programs for students with unimpaired hearing on the <u>college</u> [institute]

1 campus except as an integral part of the program offered to 2 hearing-impaired students when:

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3 (1) it is educationally appropriate to enroll hearing4 students in classes for the hearing-impaired; or

5 (2) special programs are needed to train hearing and 6 hearing-impaired persons to become professional service providers 7 for the deaf.

8 Sec. 131.004. COURSES, PROGRAMS, AND SERVICES. (a) The 9 <u>college</u> [institute] shall offer, but is not limited to offering, 10 the following courses, programs, and services for hearing-impaired 11 post-secondary students:

(1) learning development services, including academic
counseling, tutorial services, reading instruction, services to
counter learning disabilities, and library-related services;

15 (2) communications services, including interpreters 16 for academic and nonacademic functions, speech therapy, and 17 auditory evaluation and training;

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(3) academic college preparatory courses;

(4) career analysis services designed to assist each
student in identifying a career interest, considering the student's
aptitudes, abilities, and skills;

(5) regular college courses, including vocational and
 technical education and liberal arts courses;

24 (6) extracurricular activities, including intramural25 athletics; and

26 (7) postgraduation services, including job placement27 services and services designed to orient employers to

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1 hearing-impaired workers.

2 (b) The course work offered by the <u>college</u> [institute] shall emphasize self-contained classrooms with instruction conducted by 3 instructors who are trained and qualified to 4 work with 5 hearing-impaired students and are fluent in manual communication skills. Hearing-impaired students may enroll in integrated classes 6 that are regular classes offered to students with unimpaired 7 8 hearing enrolled in the junior college.

9 (c) The programs, services, and facilities of the <u>college</u> 10 [institute] shall be designed to be appropriate to the needs of 11 hearing-impaired students.

The executive director shall determine which courses 12 (d) offered by the college [institute] are appropriate 13 for an 14 electronic display on a screen or terminal, with less than 30 15 seconds delay, of a speaker's spoken message. The <u>colleg</u>e [institute] shall implement the electronic display in those 16 17 courses.

Sec. 131.005. TUITION. (a) A Texas resident student enrolled in the <u>college</u> [institute] is exempt from tuition fees under Section 54.364.

(b) A student who is not a resident of Texas shall paytuition at a rate that is the lesser of:

(1) the rate provided by this code for a nonresidentstudent enrolled at a general academic teaching institution; or

(2) a rate determined by the board of trustees and the
 <u>Texas Higher Education</u> Coordinating Board[, Texas College and
 University System] to be the approximate cost to the <u>college</u>

1 [institute], not including room and board, of educating a student 2 during the academic year beginning the next fall.

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3 Sec. 131.006. APPROPRIATIONS; GRANTS. (a) The governing 4 board of the <u>college</u> [institute] may receive appropriations for the 5 <u>college's</u> [institute's] operations only if the board operates the 6 <u>college</u> [institute] in compliance with this chapter.

7 (b) The board may accept gifts, grants, or donations of 8 money or property given to the <u>college</u> [institute] for the 9 <u>college's</u> [institute's] exclusive use in carrying out the purposes 10 of this subchapter.

11 (c) The board may expend appropriated funds for maintenance 12 and operation, including the maintenance and operation of student 13 housing and food service, unless the funds are specifically 14 restricted to another purpose by the appropriation.

15 SECTION 2. Section 51.911(a)(1), Education Code, is amended 16 to read as follows:

(1) "Institution of higher education" has the meaning
assigned by [Subdivision (7) of] Section 61.003 of this code, but
includes the Southwest College [Collegiate Institute] for the Deaf
and Texas State Technical College System [Institute].

21 SECTION 3. Section 51.925(b), Education Code, is amended to 22 read as follows:

(b) In this section, "institution of higher education" has the meaning assigned by [Subdivision (7) of] Section 61.003 of this code, except that the term includes the Southwest <u>College</u> [Collegiate Institute] for the Deaf and Texas State Technical College System [Institute].

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SECTION 4. Section 54.364(a)(5), Education Code, is amended
to read as follows:

3 (5) "Institution of higher education" has the meaning 4 assigned by Section 61.003, except that the term includes the 5 Southwest College [Collegiate Institute] for the Deaf.

6 SECTION 5. Section 31.001(8), Natural Resources Code, is 7 amended to read as follows:

8 (8) "Institution of higher education" means the Texas 9 State Technical College System, the Southwest <u>College</u> [Collegiate 10 Institute] for the Deaf, or an institution of higher education, 11 excluding a public junior college, as defined by Section 61.003, 12 Education Code.

13 SECTION 6. (a) The name of the Southwest Collegiate 14 Institute for the Deaf is changed to the Southwest College for the 15 Deaf.

(b) A reference in law to the Southwest Collegiate Institutefor the Deaf means the Southwest College for the Deaf.

(c) An appropriation for the use or benefit of the Southwest
Collegiate Institute for the Deaf is available for the use and
benefit of the Southwest College for the Deaf.

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SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
