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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the authority of pharmacists to furnish certain 3 medications. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 483.001(11), Health and Safety Code, is 5 amended to read as follows: 6 7 (11) "Practice of pharmacy" has the meaning assigned by Section 551.003, Occupations Code [means: 8 [(A) provision of those acts or services 9 necessary to provide pharmaceutical care; 10 [(B) interpretation and evaluation 11 of prescription drug orders or medication orders; 12 13 [(C) participation in drug and device selection 14 as authorized by law, drug administration, drug regimen review, drug or drug-related research; 15 [(D) provision of patient counseling; 16 17 [(E) responsibility for: 18 [(i) dispensing of prescription drug orders distribution of medication orders in the patient's best 19 20 interest; 21 [(ii) compounding and labeling of drugs and 22 devices, except labeling by a manufacturer, repackager, or 23 distributor of nonprescription drugs and commercially packaged prescription drugs and devices; 24

| 10 | SECTION 2. Subchapter C, Chapter 157, Occupations Code, is |
| 11 | amended by adding Section 157.102 to read as follows: |

| 13 | DRUGS. (a) In this section: |
| 14 | (1) "Acute condition" means a condition or disease |
| 15 | that begins abruptly, intensifies rapidly, and is generally not |
| 16 | long-lasting. |
| 17 | (2) "Pharmacist" has the meaning assigned by Section |
| 18 | <u>551.003.</u> |
| 19 | (3) "Tobacco cessation drug" means a prescription drug |
| 20 | approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration for use |
| 21 | in the treatment of nicotine or smoking addiction. |
| 22 | (4) "Travel drug" means a prescription drug |
| 23 | recommended by the federal Centers for Disease Control and |
| 24 | Prevention for individuals traveling outside of the United States |
| 25 | for the prevention and management of a disease before a diagnosis of |
| 26 | the disease. |
| 27 | (5) "Waived clinical laboratory test" means a clinical |

laboratory test that is classified as waived under federal 1 2 regulations issued under the Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments of 1988 (42 U.S.C. Section 263a). 3 4 (6) "Written protocol" means a physician's written 5 order, standing medical order, standing delegation order, or other order or protocol as defined by rule of the board. 6 (b) Notwithstanding any other law, a pharmacist may furnish 7 to a patient, as provided by a physician's written protocol, a 8 prescription drug that is: 9 10 (1) a drug to treat an acute condition that is identified through performance of one of the following tests, if 11 12 the test is a waived clinical laboratory test: (A) a rapid strep test or rapid antigen detection 13 14 test used in the identification of group A streptococcus (GAS); or 15 (B) a rapid influenza diagnostic test used in the ident_ification of influenza types A and B; 16 17 (2) a self-administered hormonal contraceptive; (3) a travel drug; 18 19 (4) a prenatal vitamin supplement; 20 (5) a tobacco cessation drug; 21 (6) a vitamin D supplement; or 22 (7) a drug identified by the executive commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission by rule as necessary for 23 24 pharmacists to furnish to patients for public health purposes. (c) The board shall adopt rules jointly with the Texas State 25 26 Board of Pharmacy to establish the minimum content of the written protocol required under Subsection (b). The written protocol may 27

| 3 | (d) A written protocol under this section must require |

No. 835 1 distributor of a nonprescription drug or commercially packaged prescription drug or device; 2 3 (iii) properly and safely storing a drug or 4 device; or 5 maintaining proper records for a drug (iv) 6 or device; 7 (F) performing for a patient a specific act of 8 drug therapy management delegated to a pharmacist by a written protocol from a physician licensed in this state in compliance with 9 10 Subtitle B; [or] administering an immunization or vaccination 11 (G) 12 under a physician's written protocol; or 13 (H) furnishing a prescription drug to a patient 14 under a physician's written protocol under Section 157.102. 15 SECTION 4. Subchapter B, Chapter 562, Occupations Code, is amended by adding Section 562.058 to read as follows: 16 17 Sec. 562.058. TRAINING REQUIRED TO INITIATE DRUG ORDER OR FURNISH CERTAIN DRUGS. (a) A pharmacist may not furnish a 18 19 prescription drug under Section 157.102 unless the pharmacist has completed a training program that is approved by the board and is 20 relevant to the condition treated by the drug. 21 (b) The board shall adopt rules jointly with the Texas 22 Medical Board to establish the minimum content of the training 23 24 program required under Subsection (a).

25 SECTION 5. Not later than January 1, 2020, the Texas State 26 Board of Pharmacy and the Texas Medical Board shall adopt the rules 27 required under Sections 157.102 and 562.058, Occupations Code, as

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1 added by this Act.

2 SECTION 6. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of this 3 section, this Act takes effect January 1, 2020.

4 (b) Section 5 of this Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
