6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:										
7	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 502, Transportation Code,										
8	is amended by adding Section 502.061 to read as follows:										
9	Sec. 502.061. REGISTRATION BY OWNER WITH CONDITION THAT										
10	IMPEDES EFFECTIVE COMMUNICATION. (a) An application for										
11	registration must provide space for the applicant to voluntarily										
12	indicate that the applicant has a health condition or disability										
13	that may impede effective communication with a peace officer. The										
14	department may request from a person who makes an indication under										
15	this subsection verification of a condition in the form of:										
16	(1) for a physical health condition, a written										
17	statement from a licensed physician; or										
18	(2) for a mental health condition, a written statement										
19	from a licensed physician, a licensed psychologist, or a										
20	non-physician mental health professional, as defined by Section										
21	571.003, Health and Safety Code.										
22	(b) The department shall provide to the Department of Public										
23	Safety the vehicle registration information of a person who										
24	voluntarily indicated on an application under Subsection (a) that										

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1 <u>the person has a health condition or disability that may impede</u> 2 <u>effective communication. The department may not provide to the</u> 3 <u>Department of Public Safety information that shows the type of</u> 4 <u>health condition or disability a person has.</u> 5 <u>(c) The Department of Public Safety shall establish a system</u> 6 <u>to include information received under Subsection (b) in the Texas</u> 7 <u>Law Enforcement Telecommunications System for the purpose of</u>

8 alerting a peace officer who makes a traffic stop that the operator
9 of the stopped vehicle may have a health condition or disability
10 that may impede effective communication.

11 (d) The Department of Public Safety may not make information 12 received under Subsection (b) available in the Texas Law 13 Enforcement Telecommunications System to a person who has access to 14 the system under a contract unless the contract prohibits the 15 person from disclosing that information to a person who is not 16 subject to the contract.

17 <u>(e) The department may not issue to a person without the</u> 18 <u>person's consent a license plate with a visible marking that</u> 19 <u>indicates to the general public that the person voluntarily</u> 20 <u>indicated on an application under Subsection (a) that the person</u> 21 <u>has a health condition or disability that may impede effective</u> 22 <u>communication.</u>

23 (f) Except as provided by Subsection (d), information 24 supplied to the department relating to an applicant's health 25 condition or disability is for the confidential use of the 26 department and the Department of Public Safety and may not be 27 disclosed to any person.

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1 SECTION 2. A Department of Public Safety contract that 2 allows a person to access the Texas Law Enforcement 3 Telecommunications System and that is in effect before the 4 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the 5 date on which the contract was entered into, and that law is 6 continued in effect for that purpose, except that the contract:

7 (1) continues only for the term of the contract; and
8 (2) may not be renewed unless the renewed contract
9 includes the prohibition required by Section 502.061(d),
10 Transportation Code, as added by this Act.

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SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
