SECTION 4. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to 2-22 a disaster remediation contract entered into on or after the effective date of this Act. A disaster remediation contract 2-23 entered into before the effective date of this Act is governed by 2-24 2**-**25 2**-**26 the law in effect when the contract was entered into, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. 2-27

SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.

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
