A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to a study on the issuance of digital identification.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS. In this Act:
- 5 (1) "Department" and "driver's license" have the
- 6 meanings assigned by Section 521.001, Transportation Code.
- 7 (2) "Digital identification" includes digital
- 8 driver's licenses and digital personal identification
- 9 certificates.
- 10 SECTION 2. STUDY AND REPORT. (a) The department shall
- 11 conduct a study on the feasibility of issuing digital
- 12 identification in this state.
- 13 (b) The study must:
- 14 (1) determine whether the department should establish
- 15 a pilot program for the issuance of digital identification;
- 16 (2) determine whether a person may use digital
- 17 identification in the same manner as a physical driver's license or
- 18 personal identification certificate, including whether
- 19 circumstances exist under which a person may not use digital
- 20 identification;
- 21 (3) assess existing department infrastructure and
- 22 identify changes required to issue digital identification in this
- 23 state;
- 24 (4) evaluate existing mobile applications that:

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- 1 (A) are capable of displaying digital
- 2 identification;
- 3 (B) include an authentication and verification
- 4 process for a wireless communication device; and
- 5 (C) may be used in any location regardless of the
- 6 location's level of wireless connectivity or cellular service; and
- 7 (5) examine methods other digital identification
- 8 programs use to maintain the security of the program, including:
- 9 (A) how other digital identification programs
- 10 ensure that the information provided by the digital identification
- 11 is accessible only for that purpose; and
- 12 (B) the security features other digital
- 13 identification programs use to protect against identity theft.
- 14 (c) Not later than December 1, 2022, the department shall
- 15 submit to the governor, lieutenant governor, and members of the
- 16 legislature a report that includes the findings of the study
- 17 conducted under this section and any legislative recommendations
- 18 based on the study.
- 19 SECTION 3. CONFIDENTIALITY. Personal identifying
- 20 information, as defined by Section 521.002, Business & Commerce
- 21 Code, collected or maintained for the study conducted by the
- 22 department under Section 2 of this Act is confidential and not
- 23 subject to disclosure under Chapter 552, Government Code.
- SECTION 4. EXPIRATION DATE. This Act expires January 1,
- 25 2023.
- 26 SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
- 27 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members

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- 1 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas
- 2 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for
- 3 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
