4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subtitle D, Title 2, Health and Safety Code, is
6	amended by adding Chapter 99 to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 99. STATE PLAN FOR ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE AND RELATED
8	<u>DISORDERS</u>
9	Sec. 99.001. DEVELOPMENT AND IMPLEMENTATION OF STATE PLAN.
10	(a) The department, using existing resources and programs to the
11	extent possible, shall develop and implement a state plan for
12	education on and treatment of Alzheimer's disease and related
13	disorders.
14	(b) The state plan must include strategies for:
15	(1) improving early detection of, reducing disease
16	onset risks for, and improving treatment of Alzheimer's disease and
17	related disorders for specific demographic groups;
18	(2) educating health care professionals, caregivers,
19	and the public to increase awareness of Alzheimer's disease and
20	related disorders;
21	(3) providing caregiver support;
22	(4) advancing basic science and applied research
23	related to Alzheimer's disease and related disorders; and
24	(5) collecting and evaluating information on efforts

- 1 to prevent and treat Alzheimer's disease and related disorders.
- 2 (c) The department shall develop the strategies described
- 3 by Subsection (b)(1) in consultation with physicians and other
- 4 health care providers licensed in this state who have clinical
- 5 training and experience in caring for persons with Alzheimer's
- 6 disease or related disorders.
- 7 Sec. 99.002. COMMENTS FROM INTERESTED PARTIES. (a) In
- 8 developing the state plan under Section 99.001, the department
- 9 shall seek comments from interested parties, including:
- 10 (1) members of the public with, or who care for persons
- 11 with, Alzheimer's disease or related disorders;
- 12 (2) each state agency that provides services to
- 13 persons with Alzheimer's disease or related disorders;
- 14 (3) any advisory body that addresses issues related to
- 15 Alzheimer's disease or related disorders;
- 16 (4) public advocates concerned with issues related to
- 17 Alzheimer's disease or related disorders;
- 18 (5) physicians and health care providers licensed in
- 19 this state who have clinical training and experience in caring for
- 20 persons with Alzheimer's disease or related disorders; and
- 21 (6) researchers of issues affecting persons with
- 22 Alzheimer's disease or related disorders.
- 23 (b) On request of the department, the commission shall
- 24 provide information and comments related to services provided to
- 25 persons with Alzheimer's disease or related disorders.
- 26 (c) The department shall meet with interested parties at
- 27 least two times each year to:

- 1 (1) facilitate comments on and discuss the progress of
- 2 developing and implementing the state plan developed under this

- 6 Sec. 99.003. REVIEW AND MODIFICATION OF STATE PLAN. The
- 7 department shall conduct a review and modify as necessary the state
- 8 plan developed under this chapter at least once every five years.
- 9 <u>Sec. 99.004. REPORT. Not later than September 1 of each</u>
- 10 even-numbered year, the department shall submit to the legislature
- 11 <u>a report on the development and implementation or the review or</u>
- 12 modification of the state plan developed under this chapter.
- 13 Sec. 99.005. GIFTS AND GRANTS. The department may accept
- 14 gifts and grants from any source to fund the duties of the
- 15 department under this chapter.
- Sec. 99.006. NO CAUSE OF ACTION, DUTY, STANDARD OF CARE, OR
- 17 LIABILITY CREATED. Notwithstanding any other law, Section 99.001,
- 18 including the use of or failure to use any information or materials
- 19 developed or disseminated under that section, does not create a
- 20 civil, criminal, or administrative cause of action or liability or
- 21 create a standard of care, obligation, or duty that provides a basis
- 22 for a cause of action.
- 23 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
