## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Sections 21.4513(a) and (b), Education Code, are 6 amended to read as follows:

- 7 (a) Using only available funds and resources from public or 8 private sources, the agency shall [periodically] conduct an audit 9 at least once every four years of the professional development 10 requirements applicable to educators in this state and any other 11 continuing education and training requirements, including state
- 12 and federal requirements and requirements imposed by school

- 2 SECTION 2. Not later than December 31, 2020, the Texas
- 3 Education Agency shall complete an audit of professional
- 4 development training requirements as required by Section 21.4513,
- 5 Education Code, as amended by this Act.
- 6 SECTION 3. The Texas Education Agency is required to
- 7 implement a provision of this Act only if the legislature
- 8 appropriates money specifically for that purpose. If the
- 9 legislature does not appropriate money specifically for that
- 10 purpose, the agency may, but is not required to, implement a
- 11 provision of this Act using other appropriations available for that
- 12 purpose.
- 13 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
