- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 20.05, Business & Commerce Code, is
- 6 amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (d) to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b), a consumer
- 9 reporting agency may not furnish a consumer report containing
- 10 information related to:
- 11 (1) a case under Title 11 of the United States Code or
- 12 under the federal Bankruptcy Act in which the date of entry of the
- 13 order for relief or the date of adjudication predates the consumer
- 14 report by more than 10 years;
- 15 (2) a suit or judgment in which the date of entry
- 16 predates the consumer report by more than seven years or the
- 17 governing statute of limitations, whichever is longer;
- 18 (3) a tax lien in which the date of payment predates
- 19 the consumer report by more than seven years;
- 20 (4) a record of arrest, indictment, or conviction of a
- 21 crime in which the date of disposition, release, or parole predates
- 22 the consumer report by more than seven years; [or]
- 23 (5) a collection account with a medical industry code,
- 24 if the consumer was covered by a health benefit plan at the time of

- 1 the event giving rise to the collection and the collection is for an
- 2 outstanding balance, after copayments, deductibles, and
- 3 coinsurance, owed to an emergency care provider or a facility-based
- 4 provider for an out-of-network benefit claim; or
- 5 (6) another item or event that predates the consumer
- 6 report by more than seven years.
- 7 <u>(d) In this section:</u>
- 8 <u>(1) "Emergency care provider" means a physician,</u>
- 9 health care practitioner, facility, or other health care provider
- 10 who provides emergency care.
- 11 (2) "Facility" has the meaning assigned by Section
- 12 324.001, Health and Safety Code.
- 13 (3) "Facility-based provider" means a physician,
- 14 health care practitioner, or other health care provider who
- 15 provides health care or medical services to patients of a facility.
- 16 (4) "Health care practitioner" means an individual who
- 17 is licensed to provide health care services.
- SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 19 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 20 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 21 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 22 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
