## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the capture and retention of certain biometric
- 3 identifiers by certain governmental entities.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 560.001, Government Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 560.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
- 8 (1) "Biometric identifier" means <u>an ear</u>, [<del>a</del>] retina,
- 9 or iris scan, <u>a</u> fingerprint, <u>a</u> voiceprint, or <u>a</u> record of <u>an</u>
- 10 <u>individual's</u> hand or face geometry, heartbeat, gait, or vascular
- 11 pattern.
- 12 (2) "Governmental entity" means this state or an
- 13 agency or political subdivision of this state [body" has the
- 14 meaning assigned by Section 552.003, except that the term includes
- 15 each entity within or created by the judicial branch of state
- 16 government].
- 17 SECTION 2. Chapter 560, Government Code, is amended by
- 18 adding Section 560.0015 to read as follows:
- 19 Sec. 560.0015. CAPTURE OF BIOMETRIC IDENTIFIER.
- 20 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b), a governmental entity
- 21 may not capture an individual's biometric identifier without the
- 22 individual's voluntary consent. Except as provided by Subsection
- 23 (c), a governmental entity may not capture, retain, or use an
- 24 individual's biometric identifier that is captured using a

- 1 photograph, video recording, or audio recording of the individual.
- 2 (b) A governmental entity may capture an individual's
- 3 biometric identifier without the individual's consent if the
- 4 capture:
- 5 (1) occurs at a location not more than 10 miles from an
- 6 international border;
- 7 (2) is authorized under a warrant;
- 8 (3) occurs during the investigation of an alleged
- 9 crime and the biometric identifier is:
- 10 (A) a fingerprint; or
- 11 (B) from an individual who is arrested for,
- 12 charged with, or convicted of the crime;
- 13 (4) is a fingerprint, heartbeat, or vascular pattern
- 14 captured by a health care provider or health care facility that
- 15 captures, possesses, or requires the biometric identifier while
- 16 providing health care services to the individual; or
- 17 (5) is required for use under Section 521.059
- 18 Transportation Code.
- 19 (c) A governmental entity may capture, retain, and use an
- 20 individual's biometric identifier that is captured using a
- 21 photograph, video recording, or audio recording of the individual
- 22 <u>if:</u>
- (1) the photograph or recording is captured in
- 24 relation to a time, place, or event connected to a criminal
- 25 investigation; and
- 26 (2) the governmental entity destroys the record of the
- 27 biometric identifier on completion of the entity's use of the

## 1 biometric identifier for:

- 2 (A) the criminal investigation; or
- 3 (B) the trial or appeal of the prosecution of an
- 4 alleged crime charged as a result of the investigation.
- 5 SECTION 3. Section 560.002, Government Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 560.002. DISCLOSURE OF BIOMETRIC IDENTIFIER. A
- 8 governmental entity [body] that possesses a biometric identifier of
- 9 an individual:
- 10 (1) may not sell, lease, or otherwise disclose the
- 11 biometric identifier to another person unless:
- 12 (A) the individual consents to the disclosure;
- 13 (B) the disclosure is required or permitted by a
- 14 federal statute or by a state statute other than Chapter 552; or
- 15 (C) the disclosure is made by or to a law
- 16 enforcement agency for a law enforcement purpose; and
- 17 (2) shall store, transmit, and protect from disclosure
- 18 the biometric identifier using reasonable care and in a manner that
- 19 is the same as or more protective than the manner in which the
- 20 governmental entity [body] stores, transmits, and protects its
- 21 other confidential information.
- SECTION 4. Chapter 560, Government Code, is amended by
- 23 adding Section 560.0025 to read as follows:
- Sec. 560.0025. DESTRUCTION AFTER ACQUITTAL OR DISMISSAL OF
- 25 CRIMINAL CHARGE. A governmental entity that captures an
- 26 <u>individual's biometric identifier based on an exception under</u>
- 27 Section 560.0015(b)(2) or (3) shall destroy all records of the

- 1 biometric identifier if the biometric identifier was collected:
- 2 (1) under a warrant issued in the investigation of an
- 3 alleged crime and charges against the individual are not filed; or
- 4 (2) exclusively in connection with the investigation
- 5 of a crime for which:
- 6 (A) the individual was subsequently acquitted;
- 7 <u>or</u>
- 8 (B) all charges against the individual resulting
- 9 from the investigation are dismissed.
- 10 SECTION 5. Section 560.003, Government Code, is amended to
- 11 read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 560.003. APPLICATION OF CHAPTER 552. A biometric
- 13 identifier in the possession of a governmental entity [body] is
- 14 exempt from disclosure under Chapter 552.
- 15 SECTION 6. Chapter 560, Government Code, is amended by
- 16 adding Sections 560.004 and 560.005 to read as follows:
- Sec. 560.004. INJUNCTIVE RELIEF; DAMAGES. (a) Any person
- 18 may institute an action for injunctive relief against a
- 19 governmental entity that appears to have captured that person's
- 20 biometric identifier in violation of this chapter.
- 21 (b) In an injunction issued under this section, a court may
- 22 include reasonable requirements to prevent further violations of
- 23 this chapter.
- 24 <u>(c) In addition to the injunctive relief provided by</u>
- 25 Subsection (a), the person may recover damages against a
- 26 governmental entity for each violation of this chapter against that
- 27 person. The person must show that a violation has occurred by a

- 1 preponderance of the evidence. Damages may not exceed \$1,000 for
- 2 <u>each violation</u>.
- 3 (d) Each day a violation occurs or continues to occur is a
- 4 separate violation.
- 5 (e) A person may recover reasonable expenses incurred in
- 6 obtaining injunctive relief or damages under this section,
- 7 including court costs, attorney's fees, investigative costs,
- 8 witness fees, and deposition expenses.
- 9 Sec. 560.005. WAIVER OF SOVEREIGN OR GOVERNMENTAL IMMUNITY.
- 10 Sovereign or governmental immunity, as applicable, of a
- 11 governmental entity to suit and from liability is waived and
- 12 abolished to the extent of liability created by this chapter.
- 13 SECTION 7. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 14 a biometric identifier, as that term is defined by Section 560.001,
- 15 Government Code, as amended by this Act, that is captured on or
- 16 after the effective date of this Act. A biometric identifier that
- 17 was captured before that date is governed by the law in effect on
- 18 the date the biometric identifier was captured, and that law is
- 19 continued in effect for that purpose.
- 20 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
