A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the authority of physicians to delegate to certain
- 3 pharmacists the implementation and modification of a patient's drug
- 4 therapy.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Sections 157.101(b) and (b-1), Occupations Code,
- 7 are amended to read as follows:
- 8 (b) A physician may delegate to a properly qualified and
- 9 trained pharmacist acting under adequate physician supervision the
- 10 performance of specific acts of drug therapy management authorized
- 11 by the physician through the physician's order, standing medical
- 12 order, standing delegation order, or other order or protocol as
- 13 defined by board rule, including the implementation or modification
- 14 of a patient's drug therapy.
- 15 (b-1) A delegation under Subsection (b) may include the
- 16 implementation or modification of a patient's drug therapy under a
- 17 protocol that calls for dangerous drugs, which delegation
- 18 <u>includes</u>[, including] the authority to sign a prescription drug
- 19 order [for dangerous drugs], only if:
- 20 (1) the delegation follows a diagnosis, initial
- 21 patient assessment, and drug therapy order by the physician;
- 22 (2) the pharmacist practices in a hospital,
- 23 hospital-based clinic, or an academic health care institution;
- 24 (3) the hospital, hospital-based clinic, or academic

- 1 health care institution in which the pharmacist practices has
- 2 bylaws and a medical staff policy that permit a physician to
- 3 delegate to a pharmacist the management of a patient's drug
- 4 therapy;
- 5 (4) the pharmacist provides the name, address, and
- 6 telephone number of the pharmacist and of the delegating physician
- 7 on each prescription signed by the pharmacist; and
- 8 (5) the pharmacist provides a copy of the protocol to
- 9 the Texas State Board of Pharmacy.
- SECTION 2. Section 554.057, Occupations Code, is amended to
- 11 read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 554.057. RULEMAKING; IMPLEMENTATION OF DRUG THERAPY
- 13 UNDER PROTOCOL. The board, with the advice of the Texas Medical
- 14 Board, shall adopt rules that allow a pharmacist to implement or
- 15 modify a patient's drug therapy pursuant to a physician's
- 16 delegation under Section 157.101(b) or (b-1) [157.101(b-1)].
- SECTION 3. Not later than January 1, 2020, the Texas State
- 18 Board of Pharmacy shall adopt rules under Section 554.057,
- 19 Occupations Code, as amended by this Act.
- 20 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
