1 AN ACT 2 relating to the feasibility of creating and maintaining a coastal barrier system. 3 Δ BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. (a) The legislature shall establish a joint 5 interim committee to continue to study the feasibility and 6 desirability of creating and maintaining a coastal barrier system 7 in this state that includes a series of gates and barriers to 8 prevent storm surge damage to gulf beaches or coastal ports, 9 10 industry, or property. The committee is composed of: 11 (b) 12 (1)the members of the standing committee of the 13 senate that has primary jurisdiction over natural resources; 14 (2) the members of the standing committee of the house 15 of representatives that has primary jurisdiction over land and resource management; 16 (3) two members of the senate appointed by 17 the lieutenant governor, each of whom represents a district in a county 18 that borders the Gulf of Mexico; and 19 20 (4) two members of the house of representatives appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives, each of 21 22 whom represents a district in a county that borders the Gulf of 23 Mexico.

24 (c) The lieutenant governor and the speaker of the house of

representatives shall jointly designate a chair or, alternatively,
designate two co-chairs from among the committee membership.

3 (d) The committee may adopt rules necessary to carry out the4 committee's duties under this section.

5 (e) Not later than December 1, 2020, the committee shall 6 report to the governor and the legislature the findings of the study 7 and any recommendations developed by the committee under this 8 section.

9 (f) The committee is abolished and this Act expires January 10 11, 2021.

11 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect June 1, 2019, if it 12 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each 13 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. 14 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for effect on that 15 date, this Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
