A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to communicable disease prevention for federal immigration detention facilities located near an international 3 border. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. The heading to Subchapter F, Chapter 12, Health 7 and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows: SUBCHAPTER F. [OFFICE OF] BORDER HEALTH 8 9 SECTION 2. Subchapter F, Chapter 12, Health and Safety Code, is amended by adding Section 12.075 to read as follows: 10 11 Sec. 12.075. COMMUNICABLE DISEASE PREVENTION FOR FEDERAL 12 IMMIGRATION DETENTION FACILITY AND SURROUNDING AREA. (a) In this section, "federal immigration detention facility" means a facility 13 14 that is operated by or under contract with United States Immigration and Customs Enforcement to enforce federal immigration 15 16 laws and that detains immigrants. (b) The department, in consultation and collaboration with 17 the Office of State-Federal Relations, the secretary of state, and 18 the attorney general, shall seek to enter into a memorandum of 19 understanding or other agreement with the appropriate federal 20 agencies or federal contractors operating federal immigration 21 detention facilities located in a county along the international 22 23 border with Mexico. 24 (c) The memorandum of understanding or agreement entered

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1	into under Subsection (b) must:
2	(1) establish appropriate protocols and procedures to
3	prevent the spread of communicable disease;
4	(2) require notice to a local or county health
5	authority of a public health condition that may become a public
6	health risk for the area surrounding a federal immigration
7	detention facility if left untreated; and
8	(3) authorize the department to establish a state
9	program in collaboration with the appropriate federal agencies or
10	contractors to mitigate the public health risks related to federal
11	immigration detention facilities.
12	(d) If authorized by the memorandum of understanding or
13	agreement entered into under Subsection (b), the department may
14	establish and operate a program to prevent the spread of
15	communicable disease from a federal immigration detention
16	facility.
17	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
18	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
19	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this

20 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

21 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.

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
