A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to the Children's Health and Nutrition Interagency

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Chapter 116, Health and Safety
- 6 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 CHAPTER 116. CHILDREN'S [EARLY CHILDHOOD] HEALTH AND NUTRITION
- 8 INTERAGENCY COUNCIL
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 116.001, Health and Safety Code, is
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- 11 Sec. 116.001. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "council" means
- 12 the <u>Children's</u> [<u>Early Childhood</u>] Health and Nutrition Interagency
- 13 Council.
- SECTION 3. Section 116.002, Health and Safety Code, is
- 15 amended to read as follows:
- 16 Sec. 116.002. REVIEW BY SUNSET ADVISORY COMMISSION. The
- 17 Sunset Advisory Commission shall review the <u>Children's</u> [<u>Early</u>
- 18 Childhood] Health and Nutrition Interagency Council as part of its
- 19 periodic review of the Department of Agriculture under Chapter 325,
- 20 Government Code (Texas Sunset Act).
- 21 SECTION 4. Section 116.003(a), Health and Safety Code, is
- 22 amended to read as follows:
- 23 (a) The Department of Agriculture shall establish the
- 24 Children's [Early Childhood] Health and Nutrition Interagency

- 1 Council. The council is composed of eight members as follows:
- 2 (1) a representative of the Health and Human Services
- 3 Commission who is involved in the coordination of children's
- 4 programs, appointed by the executive commissioner of the Health and
- 5 Human Services Commission;
- 6 (2) a representative of the Department of State Health
- 7 Services' health promotion and chronic disease prevention
- 8 programs, appointed by the commissioner of state health services;
- 9 (3) a representative of the Department of State Health
- 10 Services' Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women,
- 11 Infants and Children, appointed by the commissioner of state health
- 12 services;
- 13 (4) a representative of the Texas Workforce
- 14 Commission, appointed by the executive director of the Texas
- 15 Workforce Commission;
- 16 (5) a representative of the Department of Agriculture,
- 17 appointed by the commissioner of agriculture;
- 18 (6) a representative of the Texas Education Agency's
- 19 school health programs, appointed by the commissioner of education;
- 20 (7) a representative of the <u>Health and Human Services</u>
- 21 <u>Commission's</u> [Department of Family and Protective Services'] Child
- 22 Care Licensing Division, appointed by the executive commissioner
- 23 [of the Department of Family and Protective Services]; and
- 24 (8) a representative of the Texas A&M AgriLife
- 25 Extension Service, appointed by the director of the Texas A&M
- 26 AgriLife Extension Service.
- 27 SECTION 5. Section 116.006(a), Health and Safety Code, is

- 1 amended to read as follows:
- 2 (a) The council shall meet in person three times each year
- 3 and may hold meetings by conference call as necessary. The council
- 4 shall invite stakeholders to participate in at least two council
- 5 meetings each year and provide an opportunity for submission of
- 6 oral or written testimony. The council at a minimum shall invite:
- 7 (1) one individual with expertise in children's [early
- 8 childhood] nutrition and physical activity, such as a registered
- 9 dietician, physical therapist, or physical education specialist;
- 10 (2) one staff member or manager of a child-care
- 11 facility;
- 12 (3) one staff member or manager of a child-care
- 13 facility operated in a private residence;
- 14 (4) two individuals with medical experience in
- 15 <u>children's</u> [early childhood] health, such as a family practice
- 16 physician, registered nurse, nurse practitioner, pediatrician, or
- 17 child health consultant;
- 18 (5) one representative from a nonprofit organization
- 19 that provides family or wellness services; and
- 20 (6) one representative from an agency or organization
- 21 with expertise in community health education and outreach, such as
- 22 a local health department, public relations or marketing firm, or
- 23 university.
- SECTION 6. Section 116.007, Health and Safety Code, is
- 25 amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 116.007. COUNCIL POWERS AND DUTIES. (a) The council
- 27 shall review current research to assess:

- 1 (1) the health of children under the age of 18 [six] in
- 2 this state compared to the health of similar children in other
- 3 states;
- 4 (2) the significance of nutrition and physical
- 5 activity in the development of children under the age of 18 [six];
- 6 and
- 7 (3) the existence of nutrition and physical activity
- 8 requirements and practices in child [early childhood] care
- 9 settings.
- 10 (b) The council shall review the status of the programs
- 11 administered by each agency represented on the council that promote
- 12 healthy nutrition and physical activity for children under the age
- 13 of 18 and in child [early childhood] care settings.
- 14 (c) The council shall identify existing state and federal
- 15 funding sources available for the promotion of health and nutrition
- 16 for children under the age of 18 and in child [early childhood] care
- 17 settings.
- 18 (d) The council shall consult with key stakeholders to
- 19 identify:
- 20 (1) barriers to improving nutrition and physical
- 21 activity standards for children under the age of 18 and in child
- 22 [early childhood] care settings; and
- 23 (2) evidence-based best practices for improving
- 24 <u>children's</u> [early childhood] health through nutrition and physical
- 25 activity.
- 26 (e) The Department of Agriculture for the council may
- 27 contract with a university to study and report on best practices and

- 3 SECTION 7. Section 116.009, Health and Safety Code, is
- 4 amended to read as follows:
- 5 Sec. 116.009. CHILDREN'S [EARLY CHILDHOOD] NUTRITION AND
- 6 PHYSICAL ACTIVITY PLAN. (a) The council shall develop a children's
- 7 [an early childhood] nutrition and physical activity plan with a
- 8 recommended timeline for implementation over a six-year period.
- 9 (b) The six-year plan must account for stakeholder
- 10 recommendations, address the financing, staffing, and training
- 11 required to implement the plan, and include methods to:
- 12 (1) increase fruit and vegetable consumption among
- 13 children under the age of 18 [six];
- 14 (2) increase daily structured and unstructured
- 15 physical activity among children under the age of 18 and in child
- 16 [early childhood] care settings;
- 17 (3) increase awareness among parents of the benefits
- 18 of breast-feeding, healthy eating, and appropriate activity in
- 19 children under the age of six;
- 20 (4) facilitate the consumption of breast milk in early
- 21 childhood care settings;
- 22 (5) decrease malnutrition and undernourishment among
- 23 children under the age of 18 [six]; and
- 24 (6) engage existing community and state resources and
- 25 service providers to educate and increase the awareness of parents
- 26 and caretakers regarding the need for proper nutrition.
- 27 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
