2 (c) An unlicensed employee of the municipality or county may apply pesticides as authorized by a waiver if the unlicensed 3 employee and the licensed applicator supervising the employee 4 5 execute an affidavit promulgated by the department describing the supervision arrangement and return the affidavit to the department. 6 7 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2019. 11
