5 <u>Sec. 65.0005. EXPIRATION.</u> This chapter expires December 6 <u>31, 2031.</u>

7 SECTION 2. The Department of State Health Services is required to implement a provision of this Act only if the 8 9 legislature appropriates money specifically for that purpose. If 10 the legislature does not appropriate money specifically for that purpose, the department may, but is not required to, implement a 11 provision of this Act using other appropriations available for that 12 13 purpose.
