4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 81, Health and Safety Code, is amended by
6	adding Subchapter K to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER K. HEALTH PROFESSIONAL CONTINUING EDUCATION TO ADDRESS
8	COMMUNICABLE AND OTHER DISEASES IN BORDER COUNTIES
9	Sec. 81.451. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
10	(1) "Community health worker" has the meaning assigned
11	by Section 48.001.
12	(2) "Health professional" means an individual whose:
13	(A) vocation or profession is directly or
14	indirectly related to the maintenance of the health of another
15	individual; and
16	(B) duties require a specified amount of formal
17	education and may require a special examination, certificate or
18	license, or membership in a regional or national association.
19	(3) "HIV" means human immunodeficiency virus.
20	Sec. 81.452. APPLICABILITY OF SUBCHAPTER. This subchapter
21	applies only to a county adjacent to the international border with
22	Mexico.
23	Sec. 81.453. HEALTH PROFESSIONAL CONTINUING EDUCATION.
24	(a) To the extent funds are available, the department, in

- 1 collaboration with health authorities, local health departments,
- 2 and public health districts, shall provide to community health
- 3 workers, health professionals, and applicable employees of a local
- 4 health department or public health district continuing education
- 5 designed to reduce the incidence of communicable and other diseases
- 6 in counties described by Section 81.452.
- 7 (b) The continuing education described by Subsection (a)
- 8 may address:
- 9 <u>(1) the diagnosis and treatment of communicable and</u>
- 10 other diseases, including:
- 11 (A) tuberculosis, tuberculosis meningitis,
- 12 multidrug resistant tuberculosis, and tuberculosis and HIV
- 13 coinfections;
- 14 (B) sexually transmitted diseases and HIV; and
- 15 (C) liver diseases;
- 16 (2) methods for increasing pediatric and adult
- 17 immunization rates;
- 18 (3) strategies for improving health care system
- 19 operations related to public health, including identifying,
- 20 monitoring, tracking, and responding to communicable and other
- 21 diseases occurring in the counties described by Section 81.452; and
- 22 (4) any other matter that the department determines
- 23 will assist health professionals, local health departments, and
- 24 public health districts with addressing public health challenges
- 25 existing in those counties.
- 26 (c) The department shall identify and assess the
- 27 accessibility of continuing education resources and programs for

- 1 local health departments in counties described by Section 81.452
- 2 that may provide the continuing education described by this
- 3 section.
- 4 Sec. 81.454. FUNDING. (a) The department may solicit or
- 5 accept gifts, grants, or donations to fund health professional
- 6 continuing education under this subchapter.
- 7 (b) The department shall collaborate with state and federal
- 8 agencies, nonprofit organizations, public and private hospitals,
- 9 institutions of higher education, and the private sector to
- 10 identify, apply for, and solicit sources of funding for health
- 11 professional continuing education under this subchapter.
- 12 SECTION 2. The Department of State Health Services is
- 13 required to implement a provision of this Act only if the
- 14 legislature appropriates money specifically for that purpose. If
- 15 the legislature does not appropriate money specifically for that
- 16 purpose, the department may, but is not required to, implement a
- 17 provision of this Act using other appropriations available for that
- 18 purpose.
- 19 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
