S.B. No. 1121

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to public health laboratory capabilities in certain 3 counties. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 12, Health and Safety Code, is amended by adding Subchapter K to read as follows: 6 7 SUBCHAPTER K. PUBLIC HEALTH LABORATORY CAPABILITIES IN CERTAIN 8 COUNTIES Sec. 12.151. PUBLIC HEALTH LABORATORY REPORT. (a) Not 9 later than September 1, 2020, the department shall prepare and 10 submit a written or electronic report to the legislature on public 11 laboratories in this state's counties that are adjacent to an 12 international border. The report must include: 13 14 (1) information on the existing testing capabilities of the public laboratories, focusing on clinical, environmental, 15 16 and zoonotic testing capabilities; and (2) recommendations to increase the efficiency, 17 effectiveness, and productivity of the public laboratories through 18 administrative action and legislation. 19 (b) The department shall collaborate with local health 20 departments established under Subchapter D, Chapter 121, and public 21 and private testing laboratories to collect information and develop 22 23 recommendations for the report described by Subsection (a). 24 (c) This section expires September 1, 2021.

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Sec. 12.152. LOCAL AGREEMENTS. Using available resources 1 and as determined appropriate by the department, the department 2 shall enter into agreements with institutions of higher education 3 as defined by Section 61.003, Education Code, and public and 4 private testing laboratories in this state to increase the 5 availability of public health laboratory services for local health 6 7 departments established under Subchapter D, Chapter 121, in counties adjacent to an international border. The agreements must 8 establish protocols that: 9 10 (1) ensure confidentiality of the laboratory testing; (2) require the testing procedures to satisfy state 11 12 standards for laboratory testing; (3) provide cost-effective resources to the local 13 14 health departments to increase the availability of laboratory 15 testing in the border counties; 16 (4) enhance the laboratory testing capacity, 17 including testing of human and nonhuman specimens, in the border counties; and 18 (5) ensure the efficiency, effectiveness, 19 and accuracy of laboratory test results. 20 21 Sec. 12.153. YEAR-ROUND ACCESS TO LABORATORY TESTING FOR VECTOR-BORNE INFECTIOUS DISEASES. Using available resources and as 22 determined appropriate by the department, the department shall 23 24 support access to year-round laboratory testing for vector-borne infectious diseases to record and address local outbreaks of 25 26 vector-borne infectious diseases in the counties of this state that are most at risk for the year-round outbreaks, including Maverick, 27

3	through a local agreement entered into under Section 12.152. The
4	testing may include, as appropriate:
5	(1) arboviral testing;
6	(2) speciation testing;
7	(3) PCR testing;
8	(4) IgM testing;
9	(5) IgG testing; and
10	(6) any other testing the department determines
11	appropriate.
12	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
