## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the establishment of a sanitarian recruitment and
3	retention program in border counties for public health purposes.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 121, Health and Safety
6	Code, is amended by adding Section 121.0055 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 121.0055. SANITARIAN RECRUITMENT AND RETENTION
8	PROGRAM IN BORDER COUNTIES. (a) This section applies only to a
9	local health unit, local health department, or public health
10	district that is:
11	(1) located in a county along the international border
12	with Mexico; and
13	(2) affiliated with the department under Section
14	121.005.
15	(b) To the extent funds are available, the department shall
16	develop a program under which the department:
17	(1) provides grants to local health units, local
18	health departments, and public health districts to improve
19	recruitment and retention of sanitarians registered under Chapter
20	1953, Occupations Code; and
21	(2) expands opportunities for training and
22	registration of sanitarians to improve disease response and prevent
23	foodborne, waterborne, vector-borne, and zoonotic diseases.
24	(c) The department shall administer the grant program

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- 1 described by Subsection (b) in coordination with local health
- 2 units, local health departments, public health districts, and
- 3 appropriate state agencies, federal agencies, nonprofit
- 4 organizations, public and private hospitals, institutions of
- 5 higher education, and other private entities.
- 6 (d) The department may provide a grant under Subsection (b)
- 7 only in accordance with a contract between the department and the
- 8 recipient. The contract must include provisions under which the
- 9 department is granted sufficient control to ensure the public
- 10 purpose of improved public health is accomplished and the state
- 11 <u>receives the return benefit.</u>
- 12 (e) The department may solicit and accept gifts, grants, and
- 13 donations to operate the program established under this section.
- 14 The department shall coordinate with appropriate state agencies,
- 15 <u>federal agencies</u>, nonprofit organizations, public and private
- 16 hospitals, institutions of higher education, and other private
- 17 entities in identifying and soliciting funding to implement this
- 18 section.
- 19 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
