1-19 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
1-20 AN ACT

1-21 relating to reports on the prevalence of eating disorders and  
1-22 eating disorder-related deaths in this state.

1-23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-24 SECTION 1. (a) The Department of State Health Services, in  
1-25 collaboration with the Health and Human Services Commission, shall  
1-26 prepare a report on the prevalence of eating disorders and eating  
1-27 disorder-related deaths in this state. The report must include:

1-28 (1) statewide and regional statistics regarding the  
1-29 prevalence of eating disorders and eating disorder-related deaths  
1-30 in this state;

1-31 (2) an overview of national trends in eating  
1-32 disorders; and

1-33 (3) an overview of state-funded behavioral health  
1-34 treatment options available to persons with eating disorders.

1-35 (b) The Department of State Health Services shall gather  
1-36 information for the report required by Subsection (a) of this  
1-37 section from:

1-38 (1) information collected by the department and the  
1-39 Health and Human Services Commission, including information from  
1-40 the vital statistics unit and the state Medicaid program; and

1-41 (2) hospitals, treatment centers, available surveys,  
1-42 and other relevant sources.

1-43 (c) Not later than December 1, 2020, the Department of State  
1-44 Health Services and the Health and Human Services Commission shall  
1-45 prepare and submit to the legislature a copy of the report and any  
1-46 recommendations for legislative or other action to reduce the  
1-47 prevalence of eating disorders in this state. The department may  
1-48 post the report on the department's Internet website.

1-49 (d) The Department of State Health Services may accept  
1-50 gifts, grants, and donations from any source to fund expenses  
1-51 incurred by the department in preparing the report under this  
1-52 section.

1-53 (e) This section expires September 1, 2021.

1-54 SECTION 2. (a) The Department of State Health Services  
1-55 shall prepare a report on the prevalence of eating disorders among  
1-56 youth in this state. When administering the Youth Risk Behavior  
1-57 Survey created by the federal Centers for Disease Control and  
1-58 Prevention to youth in this state, the department may include  
1-59 additional questions as necessary to assist the department in  
1-60 assessing the prevalence of eating disorders among youth in this

2-1 state for purposes of the report.

2-2 (b) Not later than December 1, 2022, the Department of State  
2-3 Health Services shall submit to the legislature a copy of the report  
2-4 and a summary of the survey findings relating to the prevalence of  
2-5 eating disorders among youth in this state. The department may post  
2-6 the report and summary on the department's Internet website.

2-7 (c) The Department of State Health Services may accept  
2-8 gifts, grants, and donations from any source to fund expenses  
2-9 incurred by the department in preparing the report under this  
2-10 section.

2-11 (d) This section expires September 1, 2023.

2-12 SECTION 3. The Department of State Health Services is  
2-13 required to implement a provision of this Act only if the department  
2-14 receives gifts, grants, or donations specifically for that purpose  
2-15 or the legislature appropriates money specifically for that  
2-16 purpose. If the legislature does not appropriate money  
2-17 specifically for that purpose and the department does not receive  
2-18 gifts, grants, or donations specifically for that purpose, the  
2-19 department may, but is not required to, implement a provision of  
2-20 this Act using other appropriations available for that purpose.

2-21 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives  
2-22 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as  
2-23 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this  
2-24 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this  
2-25 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.

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
