6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
7	SECTION 1. Subchapter I, Chapter 2001, Government Code, is
8	amended by adding Section 2001.227 to read as follows:
9	Sec. 2001.227. TEXAS CIVIL COMMITMENT OFFICE. This chapter
10	does not:
11	(1) apply to a rule of the Texas Civil Commitment
12	Office that applies to a person who is civilly committed as a
13	sexually violent predator under Chapter 841, Health and Safety
14	Code; or
15	(2) entitle any person to judicial review of any
16	decision made or action taken under a rule described by Subdivision
17	<u>(1).</u>
18	SECTION 2. Section 841.0837, Health and Safety Code, is
19	amended to read as follows:
20	Sec. 841.0837. EMERGENCY DETENTION ORDER. The $\frac{\text{The}}{\text{Ca}}$
21	section, "peace officer" has the meaning assigned by Article 2.12,
22	Code of Criminal Procedure.

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[(b) For the purpose of returning a committed person to

- 1 housing and supervision under Section 841.0834 or a release under
- 2 Section 841.0836, the] office may issue an emergency detention
- 3 order for <u>a committed</u> [the] person's immediate apprehension and
- 4 transportation to an office-designated $[\frac{1}{4}]$ location for the purpose
- 5 of:
- 6 (1) returning the person to a more restrictive setting
- 7 following:
- 8 (A) a transfer to less restrictive housing and
- 9 supervision under Section 841.0834; or
- 10 (B) a release under Section 841.0836; or
- 11 (2) for a recently committed person who is not in the
- 12 custody of the Texas Department of Criminal Justice at the time the
- 13 commitment order is entered, bringing the person into the office's
- 14 custody [designated by the office].
- 15 SECTION 3. Section 841.084, Health and Safety Code, is
- 16 amended by adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:
- 17 (c) A committed person, on request, shall provide to the
- 18 office any financial records or other information regarding the
- 19 person's income, assets, and expenses to assist the office in
- 20 determining whether the person is indigent for purposes of this
- 21 section.
- 22 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
