- 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Chapter 370, Local Government

- 10 SECTION 2. Chapter 370, Local Government Code, is amended
- 11 by adding Section 370.007 to read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 370.007. COMMISSIONING AND EMPLOYING CERTAIN VETERANS
- 13 AS PEACE OFFICERS. Notwithstanding any other law, a political
- 14 subdivision that commissions and employs peace officers may
- 15 commission and employ as a peace officer a legal permanent resident
- 16 of the United States who is an honorably discharged veteran of the
- 17 armed forces of the United States.
- SECTION 3. Subchapter G, Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, is
- 19 amended by adding Section 1701.3095 to read as follows:
- 20 Sec. 1701.3095. LICENSING OF CERTAIN VETERANS WHO ARE LEGAL
- 21 PERMANENT RESIDENTS. The commission shall issue a peace officer
- 22 license to a person who is a legal permanent resident of the United
- 23 States if the person:
- 24 (1) meets the requirements of this chapter and the

- 1 commission's rules; and
- 2 (2) is an honorably discharged veteran of the armed
- 3 <u>forces of the United States.</u>
- 4 SECTION 4. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 5 of this Act, the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement shall amend
- 6 rules as necessary to comply with Section 1701.3095, Occupations
- 7 Code, as added by this Act.
- 8 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
