S.B. No. 1251

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

relating to unprofessional conduct by mental health providers who attempt to change the sexual orientation of a child; providing penalties.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. The heading to Chapter 105, Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows:

CHAPTER 105. UNPROFESSIONAL CONDUCT BY CERTAIN PROVIDERS [~~HEALTH CARE PROVIDER~~]

SECTION 2. Chapter 105, Occupations Code, is amended by designating Sections 105.001 and 105.002 as Subchapter A and adding a subchapter heading to read as follows:

SUBCHAPTER A. UNPROFESSIONAL CONDUCT BY HEALTH CARE PROVIDER

SECTION 3. Section 105.001, Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 105.001. DEFINITION. In this subchapter [~~chapter~~], "health care provider" means a person who furnishes services under a license, certificate, registration, or other authority issued by this state or another state to diagnose, prevent, alleviate, or cure a human illness or injury.

SECTION 4. Chapter 105, Occupations Code, is amended by adding Subchapter B to read as follows:

SUBCHAPTER B. UNPROFESSIONAL CONDUCT BY MENTAL HEALTH PROVIDER

Sec. 105.051. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:

1           (1) "Child" means an individual younger than 18 years  
2 of age.

3           (2) "Gender identity or expression" means a person's  
4 actual or perceived gender-related identity, appearance,  
5 expression, or behavior, whether or not that identity, appearance,  
6 expression, or behavior is different from that commonly associated  
7 with the person's sex as designated at birth.

8           (3) "Mental health provider" means:

9                   (A) a behavior analyst licensed under Chapter  
10 506;

11                   (B) a chemical dependency counselor licensed  
12 under Chapter 504;

13                   (C) a licensed professional counselor licensed  
14 under Chapter 503;

15                   (D) a marriage and family therapist licensed  
16 under Chapter 502;

17                   (E) a nurse licensed under Chapter 301;

18                   (F) a physician licensed under Subtitle B;

19                   (G) a psychologist licensed under Chapter 501;

20                   (H) a sex offender treatment provider licensed  
21 under Chapter 110;

22                   (I) a social worker licensed under Chapter 505;

23                   (J) a special officer for offenders with mental  
24 impairments certified under Section 1701.404; or

25                   (K) another person licensed by this state to  
26 provide professional therapy or counseling services.

27           (4) "Sexual orientation" means the actual or perceived

1 status of an individual with respect to the individual's sexuality.

2 Sec. 105.052. UNPROFESSIONAL CONDUCT. (a) A mental health  
3 provider engages in unprofessional conduct if, in the course of  
4 providing services to a child, the mental health provider attempts  
5 any practice or treatment that seeks to:

6 (1) change the child's sexual orientation or gender  
7 identity, including any effort to change gender-related behavior or  
8 gender expression; or

9 (2) eliminate or reduce sexual or romantic attractions  
10 or feelings toward persons of the same sex.

11 (b) Subsection (a) does not apply to counseling that:

12 (1) provides acceptance, support, and understanding  
13 of a child or facilitates a child's coping, social support, and  
14 identity exploration and development, including sexual  
15 orientation-neutral interventions to prevent or address unlawful  
16 conduct or unsafe sexual practices, if that counseling does not  
17 seek to change sexual orientation or gender identity or expression;  
18 or

19 (2) provides support to a child undergoing gender  
20 transition in accordance with established standards of care.

21 (c) A mental health provider who commits unprofessional  
22 conduct under Subsection (a) is subject to disciplinary action by  
23 any state regulatory entity with the power to take disciplinary  
24 action against that mental health provider.

25 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
