A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to requiring school districts to administer college
- 3 readiness assessment instruments to certain students at state cost.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 39.0261(a) and (e), Education Code, are
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) In addition to the assessment instruments otherwise
- 8 authorized or required by this subchapter:
- 9 (1) each school year and at state cost, a school
- 10 district may administer to students in the spring of the eighth
- 11 grade an established, valid, reliable, and nationally
- 12 norm-referenced preliminary college preparation assessment
- 13 instrument for the purpose of diagnosing the academic strengths and
- 14 deficiencies of students before entrance into high school;
- 15 (2) each school year and at state cost, a school
- 16 district may administer to students in the 10th grade an
- 17 established, valid, reliable, and nationally norm-referenced
- 18 preliminary college preparation assessment instrument for the
- 19 purpose of measuring a student's progress toward readiness for
- 20 college and the workplace; [and]
- 21 (3) each school year and at state cost, a school
- 22 district shall administer to students in a grade level determined
- 23 by the commissioner who have been administered the Algebra I
- 24 end-of-course assessment or English I and English II end-of-course

- 1 assessments as described by Section 39.023(a-2)(2) one of the
- 2 valid, reliable, and nationally norm-referenced assessment
- 3 instruments used by colleges and universities as part of their
- 4 undergraduate admissions processes for the purpose of fulfilling
- 5 federal requirements regarding assessment at the high school level;
- 6 and
- 7 (4) high school students in the spring of the 11th
- 8 grade or during the 12th grade, other than students administered an
- 9 <u>assessment instrument under Subdivision (3)</u>, may select and take
- 10 once, at state cost, one of the valid, reliable, and nationally
- 11 norm-referenced assessment instruments used by colleges and
- 12 universities as part of their undergraduate admissions processes.
- (e) Subsection $\underline{(a)(4)}$ [$\underline{(a)(3)}$] does not prohibit a high
- 14 school student in the [spring of the] 11th grade or during the 12th
- 15 grade from selecting and taking, at the student's own expense, one
- 16 of the valid, reliable, and nationally norm-referenced assessment
- 17 instruments used by colleges and universities as part of their
- 18 undergraduate admissions processes [more than once].
- 19 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2019-2020
- 20 school year.
- 21 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 22 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 23 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 24 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 25 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
