## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to prevention and early intervention programs and
- 3 practices.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 264.201(d), Family Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 (d) The services may include in-home programs, parenting
- 8 skills training, youth coping skills, and individual and family
- 9 counseling. If the department requires or a court orders parenting
- 10 skills training services through a prevention and early
- 11 intervention [parenting education] program or practice, the
- 12 program or practice must be an evidence-based program or practice,
- 13 promising [practice parenting education] program or practice, or
- 14 evidence-informed program or practice described by Section 265.151
- 15 that is provided in the community in which the family resides, if
- 16 available.
- SECTION 2. Section 265.004(a-1), Family Code, is amended to
- 18 read as follows:
- 19 (a-1) The department shall ensure that not less than 75
- 20 percent of the money appropriated for parenting education programs
- 21 under Subsection (a) funds evidence-based programs or practices
- 22 described by Section 265.151(b) and that the remainder of that
- 23 money funds promising [practice] programs or practices described by
- 24 Section 265.151(c) and evidence-informed programs or practices

- 1 <u>described by Section 265.151(d)</u>.
- 2 SECTION 3. The heading to Subchapter D, Chapter 265, Family
- 3 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 4 SUBCHAPTER D. EVIDENCE-BASED PROGRAMS AND PRACTICES [PARENTING
- 5 EDUCATION
- 6 SECTION 4. Section 265.151, Family Code, is amended to read 7 as follows:
- 8 Sec. 265.151. <u>REQUIREMENTS FOR</u> [PARENTING EDUCATION]
- 9 PROGRAMS AND PRACTICES ON EVIDENCE-BASED SPECTRUM. (a) A
- 10 prevention and early intervention [parenting education] program or
- 11 practice provided by the department must be an evidence-based
- 12 program or <u>practice</u>, a promising <u>program or practice</u>, or an
- 13 evidence-informed program or practice described by this section.
- (b) An evidence-based program <u>or practice</u> is a [<del>parenting</del>
- 15 <u>education</u>] program <u>or practice</u> that:
- 16 (1) is research-based and grounded in relevant,
- 17 empirical knowledge and program-determined outcomes;
- 18 (2) has comprehensive standards ensuring the highest
- 19 quality service delivery with continuous improvement in the quality
- 20 of service delivery;
- 21 (3) has demonstrated significant positive [short-term
- 22 and long-term] outcomes as required by Section 265.152;
- 23 (4) <u>is listed as an evidence-based program or practice</u>
- 24 by a nationally recognized clearinghouse associated with a state or
- 25 federal agency or an institution of higher education [has been
- 26 evaluated by at least one rigorous, random, controlled research
- 27 trial across heterogeneous populations or communities with

- 1 research results that have been published in a peer-reviewed
- 2 journal];
- 3 (5) substantially complies with a program or practice
- 4 manual or design that specifies the purpose, outcomes, duration,
- 5 and frequency of the program or practice services; [and]
- 6 (6) employs well-trained and competent staff and
- 7 provides continual relevant professional development opportunities
- 8 to the staff;
- 9 (7) is associated with a national organization,
- 10 institution of higher education, or national or state public health
- 11 <u>institute;</u>
- 12 (8) demonstrates substantial connections to other
- 13 community-based services; and
- 14 (9) for crisis counseling, individual therapy, family
- 15 therapy, clinical services, and other recognized professional
- 16 practices requires:
- 17 (A) providers to meet any state requirements for
- 18 professional licensure or certification; and
- 19 (B) practices to have empirical evidence to
- 20 support the effectiveness of the practice.
- 21 (c) A promising [practice] program or practice is a
- 22 parenting education program or practice that:
- 23 (1) has an active impact evaluation program or
- 24 practice or demonstrates a schedule for implementing an active
- 25 impact evaluation program or practice;
- 26 (2) is listed as a promising program or practice by a
- 27 nationally recognized clearinghouse associated with a state or

- 1 federal agency or an institution of higher education [has been
- 2 evaluated by at least one outcome-based study demonstrating
- 3 effectiveness or random, controlled trial in a homogeneous sample];
- 4 (3) substantially complies with a program or practice
- 5 manual or design that specifies the purpose, outcomes, duration,
- 6 and frequency of the program or practice services;
- 7 (4) employs well-trained and competent staff and
- 8 provides continual relevant professional development opportunities
- 9 to the staff; [and]
- 10 (5) is research-based and grounded in relevant,
- 11 empirical knowledge and program-determined outcomes; and
- 12 (6) demonstrates substantial connections to other
- 13 community-based services.
- 14 (d) An evidence-informed program or practice is a program or
- 15 practice that:
- 16 (1) combines well-researched interventions with
- 17 clinical experience, ethics, and client preferences and culture to
- 18 guide and inform the delivery of treatments and services;
- 19 (2) has an active impact evaluation program or
- 20 demonstrates a schedule for implementing an active impact
- 21 <u>evaluation program;</u>
- 22 (3) substantially complies with a program or practice
- 23 manual or design that specifies the purpose, outcome, duration, and
- 24 frequency of the program or practice services; and
- 25 (4) employs well-trained and competent staff and
- 26 provides continual relevant professional development opportunities
- 27 to the staff.

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- 1 SECTION 5. Section 265.152, Family Code, is amended to read
- 2 as follows:
- 3 Sec. 265.152. OUTCOMES OF PREVENTION AND EARLY INTERVENTION
- 4 PROGRAMS AND PRACTICES [EVIDENCE-BASED PARENTING EDUCATION]. The
- 5 department shall ensure that a prevention and early intervention
- 6 [parenting education] program or practice provided under this
- 7 <u>subchapter</u> [chapter] achieves favorable behavioral outcomes in at
- 8 least two of the following areas:
- 9 (1) improved cognitive development of children;
- 10 (2) increased [ $\frac{\text{school}}{\text{school}}$ ] readiness  $\frac{\text{for and}}{\text{school}}$
- 11 participation and performance in school [of children];
- 12 (3) reduced child abuse, neglect, and injury;
- 13 (4) improved child safety;
- 14 (5) improved social-emotional development of children
- 15 and youth;
- 16 (6) <u>increased protective factors</u> [<u>improved parenting</u>
- 17 skills], including nurturing, [and] bonding, and other parenting
- 18 skills;
- 19 (7) improved family economic self-sufficiency;
- 20 (8) reduced parental or youth involvement with the
- 21 criminal justice system; [and]
- 22 (9) increased paternal involvement and support:
- 23 (10) improved maternal and child health; and
- 24 (11) increased protective factors for youth.
- 25 SECTION 6. Section 265.153, Family Code, is amended to read
- 26 as follows:
- Sec. 265.153. EVALUATION OF PREVENTION AND EARLY

- 1 <u>INTERVENTION PROGRAMS AND PRACTICES</u> [EVIDENCE-BASED PARENTING
- 2 EDUCATION]. (a) The department shall adopt outcome indicators to
- 3 measure the effectiveness of <u>prevention</u> and early intervention
- 4 [parenting education] programs and practices provided under this
- 5 subchapter [chapter] in achieving desired outcomes.
- 6 (b) The department may work directly with the model
- 7 developer of a prevention and early intervention [parenting
- 8 <u>education</u>] program <u>or practice</u> to identify appropriate outcome
- 9 indicators for the program or practice and to ensure that the
- 10 program or practice substantially complies with the model.
- 11 (c) The department shall develop internal processes to
- 12 share information with prevention and early intervention service
- 13 providers [parenting education programs] to assist the department
- 14 in analyzing the performance of the programs or practices.
- 15 (d) The department shall use information obtained under
- 16 this section to:
- 17 (1) monitor prevention and early intervention
- 18 [parenting education] programs and practices;
- 19 (2) continually improve the quality of the programs
- 20 and practices; and
- 21 (3) evaluate the effectiveness of the programs and
- 22 practices.
- SECTION 7. Section 265.154, Family Code, is amended to read
- 24 as follows:
- Sec. 265.154. REPORTS TO LEGISLATURE. (a) Not later than
- 26 December 1 of each even-numbered year, the department shall prepare
- 27 and submit a report on state-funded prevention and early

- 1 <u>intervention</u> [parenting education] programs and practices to the
- 2 standing committees of the senate and house of representatives with
- 3 jurisdiction over child protective services.
- 4 (b) A report submitted under this section must include:
- 5 (1) a description of the prevention and early
- 6 <u>intervention</u> [parenting education] programs <u>and practices</u>
- 7 implemented and of the models associated with the programs and
- 8 practices;
- 9 (2) information on the families served by the programs
- 10 and practices, including the number of families served and their
- 11 demographic information;
- 12 (3) the goals and achieved outcomes of the programs
- 13 and practices;
- 14 (4) information on the cost for each family served,
- 15 including any available third-party return-on-investment analysis;
- 16 and
- 17 (5) information explaining the percentage of money
- 18 spent on evidence-based programs and practices, on promising
- 19 [practice] programs and practices, and on evidence-informed
- 20 programs and practices.
- 21 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
