3 (3) a person who contracts with government to perform 4 a service in a facility as defined by Section 1.07(a)(14), Penal 5 Code, or Section 51.02(13) or (14), Family Code, or an employee of 6 that person:

7 (A) while the person or employee is engaged in 8 performing a service within the scope of the contract, if the actor 9 knows the person or employee is authorized by government to provide 10 the service; or

(B) in retaliation for or on account of the person's or employee's performance of a service within the scope of the contract;

14 (4) a person the actor knows is a security officer15 while the officer is performing a duty as a security officer;

16 (5) a person the actor knows is emergency services 17 personnel while the person is providing emergency services; [or]

18 (6) a pregnant individual to force the individual to

22 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only 23 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. 24 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is 25 governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed, 26 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For 27 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the

effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred
 before that date.

3 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
