S.B. No. 1390

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT relating to suicide prevention in public school curriculum and 2 3 certain educational programs concerning suicide prevention and 4 substance abuse prevention. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. Section 21.451(d), Education Code, is amended to 7 read as follows: 8 (d) The staff development: (1) may include training in: 9 10 (A) technology; conflict resolution; 11 (B) discipline strategies, including classroom 12 (C) 13 management, district discipline policies, and the student code of conduct adopted under Section 37.001 and Chapter 37; 14 15 (D) preventing, identifying, responding to, and reporting incidents of bullying; and 16 digital learning; 17 (E) subject to Subsection (e) and to Section 21.3541 18 (2) and rules adopted under that section, must include training that is 19 evidence-based, as defined by Section 8101, Every Student Succeeds 20 Act (20 U.S.C. Section 7801), that: 21 22 (A) relates to instruction of students with 23 disabilities; and 24 (B) is designed for educators who work primarily

1 outside the area of special education; and

2 (3) must include suicide prevention training that must3 be provided:

4 (A) on an annual basis, as part of a new employee
5 orientation, to all new school district and open-enrollment charter
6 school educators; and

7 (B) to existing school district and
8 open-enrollment charter school educators <u>at least once every five</u>
9 <u>years</u> [on a schedule adopted by the agency by rule].

SECTION 2. Section 28.002, Education Code, is amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows:

(a) Each school district that offers kindergarten throughgrade 12 shall offer, as a required curriculum:

15 (1)a foundation curriculum that includes: 16 (A) English language arts; 17 (B) mathematics; 18 (C) science; and social studies, consisting of Texas, United 19 (D) States, and world history, government, economics, with emphasis on 20 the free enterprise system and its benefits, and geography; and 21 an enrichment curriculum that includes: 22 (2) to the extent possible, languages other than 23 (A) 24 English; 25 (B) health, with emphasis on: 26 (i) physical health, including the 27 importance of proper nutrition and exercise;

1	(ii) mental health, including instruction
2	on mental health conditions, substance abuse, skills to manage
3	emotions, establishing and maintaining positive relationships, and
4	responsible decision-making; and
5	(iii) suicide prevention, including
6	recognizing suicide-related risk factors and warning signs;
7	(C) physical education;
8	(D) fine arts;
9	(E) career and technology education;
10	(F) technology applications;
11	(G) religious literature, including the Hebrew
12	Scriptures (Old Testament) and New Testament, and its impact on
13	history and literature; and
14	(H) personal financial literacy.
15	(a-1) In adopting the essential knowledge and skills for the
16	health curriculum under Subsection (a)(2)(B), the State Board of
17	Education shall adopt essential knowledge and skills that address:
18	(1) the relationship between drug and alcohol use and
19	suicide;
20	(2) recognizing signs of suicidal tendencies and other
21	warning signs of suicide;
22	(3) the risk of suicide or violent behavior as a side
23	effect of psychotropic medication; and
24	(4) help-seeking behaviors and available community
25	suicide prevention services.
26	SECTION 3. Section 28.004, Education Code, is amended by
27	amending Subsection (c) and adding Subsection (o) to read as

follows: 1 2 (c) The local school health advisory council's duties include recommending: 3 the number of hours of instruction to be provided 4 (1)5 in health education; 6 (2) policies, procedures, strategies, and curriculum 7 appropriate for specific grade levels designed to prevent obesity, cardiovascular disease, Type 2 diabetes, and mental health 8 9 concerns, including suicide, through coordination of: health education; 10 (A) 11 (B) physical education and physical activity; (C) nutrition services; 12 parental involvement; 13 (D) (E) instruction to 14 prevent the use of 15 e-cigarettes, as defined by Section 161.081, Health and Safety 16 Code, and tobacco; 17 (F) school health services; 18 (G) counseling and guidance services; a safe and healthy school environment; and 19 (H) school employee wellness; 20 (I) appropriate levels and 21 (3) grade methods of 22 instruction for human sexuality instruction; (4) strategies for integrating the 23 curriculum 24 components specified by Subdivision (2) with the following elements 25 in a coordinated school health program for the district: (A) school health services; 26 27 (B) counseling and guidance services;

No. 1390 a safe and healthy school environment; and 1 (C) 2 (D) school employee wellness; and (5) if feasible, joint use agreements or strategies 3 for collaboration between the school district and community 4 organizations or agencies. 5 6 (o) The local school health advisory council shall make 7 policy recommendations to the district to increase: (1) parental awareness of suicide-related risk 8 factors and warning signs and available community suicide 9 prevention services; and 10 11 (2) school personnel awareness of risks and side effects associated with psychotropic medications, with particular 12 13 attention to suicidal thoughts or actions, agitation, aggression, hostility, mania, akathisia, and other risks and side effects that 14 15 may be associated with violent or self-harming behavior. 16 SECTION 4. Section 161.325(a-1), Health and Safety Code, as amended by Chapter 714 (H.B. 4056) and Chapter 522 (S.B. 179), Acts 17 of the 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017, is reenacted and 18 amended to read as follows: 19 20 (a-1) The list must include programs and practices in the following areas: 21 22 early mental health prevention and intervention; (1)(2) [mental health promotion; 23 24 substance abuse prevention and intervention; [(3)]25 (3) [(4) substance abuse intervention; [(5)] suicide prevention, intervention, 26 and 27 postvention;

1 <u>(4)</u> [(6)] grief-informed and trauma-informed 2 practices;

3 (5) [(7)] building skills related to managing 4 emotions, establishing and maintaining positive relationships, and 5 responsible decision-making;

6 (6) [(8)] positive behavior interventions and 7 supports and positive youth development; and

8 <u>(7)</u> [(9)] safe<u>,</u> [and] supportive<u>, and positive</u> school 9 climate.

10 SECTION 5. Section 161.325, Health and Safety Code, is 11 amended by adding Subsection (a-4) and amending Subsections (b) and 12 (d) to read as follows:

13 (a-4) In this section, "postvention" includes activities 14 that promote healing necessary to reduce the risk of suicide by a 15 person affected by the suicide of another.

(b) The suicide prevention programs on the list must include components that provide for training counselors, teachers, nurses, administrators, and other staff, as well as law enforcement officers and social workers who regularly interact with students, to:

(1) recognize students at risk of committing suicide, including students who are or may be the victims of or who engage in bullying;

(2) recognize students displaying early warning signs
and a possible need for early mental health or substance abuse
intervention, which warning signs may include declining academic
performance, depression, anxiety, isolation, unexplained changes

in sleep or eating habits, and destructive behavior toward self and
 others; [and]

3 (3) intervene effectively with students described by
4 Subdivision (1) or (2) by providing notice and referral to a parent
5 or guardian so appropriate action, such as seeking mental health or
6 substance abuse services, may be taken by a parent or guardian; and
7 (4) assist students in returning to school following

8 treatment of a mental health concern or suicide attempt.

9 (d) A school district <u>shall</u> [may] develop practices and 10 procedures concerning each area listed in Subsection (a-1), 11 including mental health promotion and intervention, substance 12 abuse prevention and intervention, and suicide prevention, that:

(1) include a procedure for providing notice of a recommendation for early mental health or substance abuse intervention regarding a student to a parent or guardian of the student within a reasonable amount of time after the identification of early warning signs as described by Subsection (b)(2);

18 (2) include a procedure for providing notice of a 19 student identified as at risk of committing suicide to a parent or 20 guardian of the student within a reasonable amount of time after the 21 identification of early warning signs as described by Subsection 22 (b)(2);

(3) establish that the district 23 may develop а reporting mechanism and may designate at least one person to act as 24 a liaison officer in the district for the purposes of identifying 25 students in need of early mental health or substance abuse 26 27 intervention or suicide prevention; [and]

1 (4) set out available counseling alternatives for a parent or guardian to consider when their child is identified as 2 possibly being in need of early mental health or substance abuse 3 intervention or suicide prevention; and 4 5 (5) include procedures: 6 (A) to support the return of a student to school 7 following hospitalization or residential treatment for a mental health condition or substance abuse; and 8 (B) for suicide prevention, intervention, and 9 10 postvention. SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019. 11

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
