- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 162.304(b-1), Family Code, is amended to
- 7 read as follows:

- 8 (b-1) Subject to the availability of funds, the department
- 9 shall pay a \$150 subsidy each month for the premiums for health
- 10 benefits coverage for a child with respect to whom a court has
- 11 entered a final order of adoption if the child:
- 12 (1) was in the conservatorship of the department at
- 13 the time of the child's adoptive placement;
- 14 (2) after the adoption, is eligible for <u>and not</u>
- 15 receiving medical assistance under Chapter 32, Human Resources
- 16 Code; and
- 17 (3) is younger than 18 years of age.
- 18 SECTION 2. Subchapter A, Chapter 533, Government Code, is
- 19 amended by adding Section 533.00531 to read as follows:
- 20 <u>Sec. 533.00531. POST-ADOPTION MEDICAID BENEFITS FOR</u>
- 21 CERTAIN CHILDREN FORMERLY IN FOSTER CARE. (a) This section
- 22 applies only with respect to an adopted child who:
- 23 (1) is younger than 18 years of age; and
- 24 (2) was in the conservatorship of the Department of

- 1 Family and Protective Services at the time the child was adopted.
- 2 (b) To the extent permitted by federal law, the commission,
- 3 in consultation with the Department of Family and Protective
- 4 Services, shal<u>l develop and implement a program that allows the</u>
- 5 adoptive parent of a child described by Subsection (a), regardless
- 6 of the income or resources of the parent, to elect on behalf of the
- 7 child to receive or, if applicable, continue receiving benefits:
- 8 <u>(1) under the STAR Health program; or</u>
- 9 (2) if the child has a severe disability, as defined by
- 10 commission rule, under the STAR Kids managed care program.
- 11 (c) The program required by this section must:
- 12 (1) ensure each child receives benefits under the STAR
- 13 Health program that are comparable to the benefits the child would
- 14 have received had the child remained in the conservatorship of the
- 15 Department of Family and Protective Services; and
- 16 (2) protect the continuity of care for each child and,
- 17 if applicable, ensure coordination between the STAR Health program
- 18 and the STAR Kids managed care program for each child with a severe
- 19 disability who is transitioning between the programs.
- 20 (d) The executive commissioner shall adopt rules necessary
- 21 to implement this section.
- 22 SECTION 3. Section 162.304(f), Family Code, is repealed.
- 23 SECTION 4. As soon as possible after the effective date of
- 24 this Act, the Health and Human Services Commission shall apply for
- 25 and actively pursue from the federal Centers for Medicare and
- 26 Medicaid Services or other appropriate federal agency any waiver or
- 27 other authorization necessary to implement Section 533.00531,

- 1 Government Code, as added by this Act. The commission may delay
- 2 implementing this Act until the waiver or authorization is granted.
- 3 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
