A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to access to medication-assisted treatment for opioid use 3 disorder under Medicaid.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

- 5 SECTION 1. (a) In this section, "qualifying practitioner"
- 6 has the meaning assigned by 21 U.S.C. Section 823(g)(2)(G)(iii).
- 7 (b) Not later than November 1, 2019, the Health and Human
- 8 Services Commission shall amend the commission's Medicaid
- 9 Substance Use Disorder Services Medical Policy and any other
- 10 provider or claims payment policy or manual necessary to authorize
- 11 Medicaid medical benefits reimbursement for the prescribing of
- 12 buprenorphine for the treatment of an opioid use disorder by an
- 13 advanced practice registered nurse recognized by the Texas Board of
- 14 Nursing as a clinical nurse specialist, nurse anesthetist, or nurse
- 15 midwife, provided that the advanced practice registered nurse:
- 16 (1) is a qualifying practitioner; and
- 17 (2) has obtained a waiver from registration
- 18 requirements as provided by 21 U.S.C. Section 823(g).
- 19 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 20 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 21 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 22 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 23 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.

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
